## July Clubhouse Games

### Week 1: Hunt for Treasure

Kids love finding hidden objects and although this fun game to play at home does take a bit of preparation, the fun it provides is worth it. Begin by writing clues on small folded slips of paper. Each clue leads kids to the next place with an additional note. When the kids reach the end, they find a prize. Alternatively, leave coins in each spot, beginning with pennies and working up to the end and a larger amount of money.

### Week 1: Scripture Paper Cut!

Pick a verse and print it out on a piece of paper. Cut the words out of the verse and mix them up in a pile. Take away one word at a time and see if they know which word is missing!



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### Week 2: Find the Hiders!

For indoor hide and seek, you may wish to set a limit on the areas in which they hide. Older children will enjoy an evening game played outside in the dark – have the person playing “It” carry a flashlight for safety. Vary the time “It” counts depending on the age level of players and the size of the playing area. The last person found becomes the new “It.”

### Week 2: Scripture Slow or Fast?

Pick a verse and print it out on a piece of paper (or use the small group guide!). Cut the words out of the verse and mix them up in a pile. Who ever can say the scripture the fastest wins a round and who can say it the slowest wins another round. Take turns and tally up the score!



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### Week 3: Sock Bowling!

Bowling games for indoor fun? You betcha! Make a few “snowballs” out of pairs of socks, get some household items that you could use for pins, and you’re all set. Kids can take turns bowling to score, and they could even take the risk of a longer shot worth more points!

### Week 3: Scripture Challenge!

Pick a random verse in the Bible! Have your kiddo try and find it in the bible. Even more fun is having multiple people try and find it at the same time. The first person to get to the verse wins! Repeat as much as you’d like!



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### Week 4: Balancing Beam

Stick different colored tapes tape on the floor. Each colored tape can have a different rule to walk on. For example, you can ask your kiddo to walk on one leg on the red colored tape. Your kiddo has to walk only on the tape. If he/she falls off the tape, they'll be out of the game. Your kiddo that walks the entire length of the tape without falling off the tape wins the game.

### Week 4: Scripture Word Wipe Out

Write your memory verse on a chalkboard or dry erase board. Say it together. Erase one word. Say it again. Keep going until the whole verse is erased.
