

August Clubhouse Games

Week 1: Freeze!

Choose some of your kids' favorite music and have them dance until the music stops, at which point they must freeze. You can have them freeze in whatever position they are in when the music stops or specify a position. Some good choices are the shapes of:Boys on one side and girls on the other. one way on the end then back.

Animals
Expressing an emotion
Letter
Plants – trees or flowers
Yoga positions

Week 1: Scripture Scramble

Pick a Scripture (Monthly verse is a great pick!) and print it out on a piece of paper. Cut the words out of the verse and mix them up in a pile. Take turns putting the verse back together and see who can put it together the fastest!



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Week 2: Hide and Seek

For indoor hide and seek, you may wish to set a limit on the areas in which they hide. Older children will enjoy an evening game played outside in the dark – have the person playing "It" carry a flashlight for safety. Vary the time "It" counts depending on the age level of players and the size of the playing area. The last person found becomes the new "It."

Week 2: Scripture Fastest/Slowest

Pick a Scripture (Monthly verse is a great pick!) and print it out on a piece of paper (or use the small group guide!). Cut the words out of the verse and mix them up in a pile. Who ever can say the scripture the fastest wins a round and who can say it the slowest wins another round. Take turns and tally up the score!



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Week 3: Treasure Hunt

Kids love finding hidden objects and although this fun game to play at home does take a bit of preparation, the fun it provides is worth it. Begin by writing clues on small folded slips of paper. Each clue leads kids to the next place with an additional note. When the kids reach the end, they find a prize. Alternatively, leave coins in each spot, beginning with pennies and working up to the end and a larger amount of money.

Week 3: Scripture Bible Challenge

Pick a random verse in the Bible! Have your kiddo try and find it in the bible. Even more fun is having multiple people try and find it at the same time. The first person to get to the verse wins! Repeat as much as you'd like!



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Week 4: Sock Basketball!

Basketball games for indoor fun? You betcha! Make a few "snowballs" out of pairs of socks, get a laundry basket (or smaller receptacles for more challenge), and you're all set. Kids can take turns shooting to score, and they could even take the risk of a longer shot worth more points!

Week 4: Scripture Take-Away

Pick a Scripture (Monthly verse is a great pick!) and print it out on a piece of paper. Cut the words out of the verse and mix them up in a pile. Take away one word at a time and see if they know which word is missing!



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Week 5: Sardines (Opposite of Hide & Seek)

In the game of Sardines everyone is a seeker while one person hides. As soon as a seeker finds the hider, he or she must join the hider in the hiding spot. (It's a fun challenge to discover a hiding spot that will fit your whole crowd!) The last person to find the spot becomes the hider for the next round.

Week 5: Scripture Memory Verse Basketball

Use the monthly memory verse for this awesome game! Use paper or small balls and a can as a basket. Have kids score basketball goals to earn words of the memory verse so they can piece it together!
