## WARREN NEIDICH – Art as a tool of COGNITIVE ACTIVISM

This summer, two of WARREN NEIDICH'S most important neon installations to date, THE PIZZAGATE NEON (2017-2021) and THE PARTHENON MARBLES RECODED: THE PHANTOM AS OTHER (2021), will be on view in Munich and Berlin.



WARREN NEIDICH'S artistic work exists at the frontier of art and science. He suggests that we are moving from an information and knowledge-based economy to one that is neural-based. He creates complex text-based neon installations that examine the effects of neoliberal policies and the associated use of technology on our brains and minds. He asks: Are fake news and Google bubbles the new tools of governmental and corporate control which operate both in the political and social field as well as upon our brain's neural plasticity? How can art use aesthetic methods as a means to create new possibilities to counter these regimes of power?

From July 30 until September 14, THE PIZZAGATE NEON (2017–2021) will be on view at Haus der Kunst in Munich as part of the exhibition THE WORLD: REGLITTERIZED. PARADISE IS EXACTLY LIKE WHERE YOU ARE RIGHT NOW... ONLY MUCH BETTER. Previously exhibited at the Venice Biennale 2019 and Priska Pasquer Gallery in Cologne, THE PIZZAGATE NEON is a critique of our data-driven society which has led to a post-truth era characterized by a deluge of fictive mediated stories dubbed 'fake news.'

One of these stories concerns the de-bunked conspiracy theory 'Pizzagate' circulating at the end of the 2016 Clinton-Trump United States presidential election which alleged that Hillary Clinton and other members of her Democratic election committee were running an human trafficking and child sex ring in the basement of the Comet Ping Pong pizzeria in Washington, D.C.. The suspended multicolored text-based neon sculpture is shaped in the form of a network through which everything is connected resembling both the iCloud (where data is stored online) and the connectome (a comprehensive map of our neural connections). This non-hierarchical network where everything is related creates the conditions in which delusional thought can flourish.

Until September 30, THE PARTHENON MARBLES RECODED: THE PHANTOM AS OTHER (2021) can be viewed at the Kunstverein Rosa-Luxemburg Platz in Berlin as part of Activist Neuroaesthetics, a yearlong festival of events celebrating the 25 year anniversary of <a href="mailto:arthrain.org">arthrain.org</a> (Journal of Neuroaesthetics and Chaoid Gallery).

THE PARTHENON MARBLES RECODED is an example of the neuroaesthetic work which Warren Neidich has been developing since the mid-90s. In THE PARTHENON MARBLES RECODED, psychic energy emanating from the phantom limbs of broken arms and legs of this classic greek sculpture form a connection with an artificial intelligence that helps inform digital governance of the future. The phantom limb, a cognitive neuroscience concept which refers to the syndrome of feeling sensations in a limb that has been removed, is used here as a metaphor for the Other and the sculpture proposes a new way forward. As so much of our future will be integrated with machine learning, Neidich's work explores its complicated relationship with big data and the brain. He is interested in what he calls a 'radical posthumanism' in which the notion of humanism is expanded and activated to include a more diverse range of genders, ethnicities, cultures, and religious denominations.

Both artworks vividly and playfully demonstrate the entanglements of politics, consumption and the transformation of values. Neidich's intention is not to make another dystopian model of the future, but instead to create new models full of hope. He sees art as a way to activate our awareness towards possible alternatives to the predominance of standardized and statistically derived schema. In his conceptual art, neon lights and attention grabbing colors help to engage the spectator in an alternative marketplace of philosophically-based ideas.

WARREN NEIDICH is based in Berlin and New York. He has a multidisciplinary background in fine art, neuroscience, medicine and architecture. In 1997, he co-founded artbrain.org and Journal of Neuroaesthetics with Nathalie Anglés, director of Residency Unlimited, New York City. Neidich is founder and director of Saas-Fee Summer Institute of Art, as well as having served as a visiting tutor at Goldsmiths College in London and a Professor at the Weissensee Kunsthochschule, Berlin. He has been visiting lecturer at such institutions as Harvard University, Brown University, Princeton University, Columbia University, University of Oxford, Cambridge University, and Sorbonne, Paris. Neidich has exhibited internationally including MoMA PS1, Whitney Museum of American Art, Museum Ludwig, Cologne, ZKM Karlsruhe and KW Institute for Contemporary Art, Berlin.
