



### How do we Spent our Sports Premium?

As part of the Governments initiative to improve the health and fitness of young people in schools Merton Junior School received a total sports premium of £8,546.00 this financial year (£3407 on 29.4.14 and £5139 on 10.11.14). We have used this money to pay for Basingstoke Town Football Club, Dan Bridle and an external archery provider to come and teach the children throughout the year.

The breakdown of how our funding has been spent is as follows:

- Basingstoke Football club £6562.50
- Dan Bridle (Dance Lessons) £1850.00
- Archery £412
- A total of £8824.50

### What impact has our Sports Premium had on the teaching and learning of PE?

Every Thursday our sports coaches spend the day in school teaching a wide variety of sports and games as per the new national curriculum for 2014. The aim is for the children to be provided with quality PE teaching on a weekly basis, which ensures that the children are taught the four key skills within PE: *acquiring and developing skills; selecting & applying skills, tactics and compositional ideas; evaluate & improve performance; knowledge & understanding of fitness & health.*

This academic year our sports coaches have had the following impact (all percentages are calculated using end of year expectations for each year group)

#### Year 3

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations (Football, dance, badminton, gymnastics, basketball and Benchball)

- All pupils = 81%
- SEN = 93%
- FSM6 = 78%

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations compared to 2013/2014 year (football, gymnastics, dance and basketball)

- All pupils = **78%** compared to last year 78%
- SEN = **92%** an increase of 17% compared to last year 75%

#### Year 4

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations (Football, Gymnastics, Hockey, Dance, Basketball and Benchball)

- All pupils = **91%**
- SEN = **92%**
- FSM6 = **92%**

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations compared to 2013/2014 year (Football, Gymnastics, Hockey, Dance, Basketball)

- All pupils = **92%** an increase of 12% compared to last year 80%
- SEN = **93%** an increase of 26% compared to last year 66%
- FSM6 = **93%** an increase of 9% compared to last year 84%

#### Year 5

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations (football, dance, gymnastics, hockey, Basketball, badminton)

- All pupils = **87%**
- SEN = **84%**
- FSM6 = **88%**

#### Year 6

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations (football, benchball, gymnastics, hockey, badminton and basketball)

- All pupils = **86%**
- SEN = **71%**
- FSM6 = **76%**

At, or above, Age-Related Expectations compared to 2013/2014 (gymnastics, hockey and basketball)

- All pupils = **86%** an increase of 19% compared to last year - 67%
- SEN = **68%** an increase of 9% compared to last year - 59%
- FSM6 = **72%** an increase of 7% compared to last year - 65%

What impact has the sports premium had on club attendance?

Basingstoke Football club also run an after school club, which every child in the school is given the opportunity to attend.

After school clubs that they have run this year:

- Basketball
- Gymnastics club
- Benchball
- Rugby
- Cricket and rounders

Mr Bridle our Dance teacher has run a dance club all year.

**All clubs have been filled to capacity every term.**

The percentage breakdown is as follows:

**36%** of spaces in sports clubs were attended by FSM6 children in the Autumn term 2014. **18%** of spaces in sports clubs were filled by SEN children in the Autumn Term 2014.

**Year 3 - 46%** of the children have attended one+ of the sports clubs this year.

**Year 4 - 39%** of the children have attended one+ of the sports clubs this year.

**Year 5 - 49%** of the children have attended one+ of the sports clubs this year.

**Year 6 - 88%** of the children have attended one+ of the sports clubs this year.

What additional workshops has the sports premium provided the school with?

Archery workshop - attended by **100%** of year 6 children

Information from pupil interviews regarding workshops:

**100%** of children enjoyed the workshops and were glad they took part.

*'I loved the archery because it gave me the chance do something I had never done before' (Year 6)*
