**"Facebook BVS Hike" comments & Report: Members Feedback is super positive. Especially on the trail maintenance on Sycamore Canyon. We have hiked most trails in BVS. Please express the gratitude we feel for the beauty, creation and upkeep of these trails. Thank you!*

The upper trails are not sufficiently marked. Signage was incomplete and did not match the map.

- > From Water Canyon Campground - only trailhead sign was Quail Ridge.
- > Missing from that location the trailheads of - Sycamore Canyon, High Country, Brookside and Quail Canyon.
- > I think we took Brookside and then it "teed" into another trail. (we thought High Country) According to the map, we should have turned right. But after wandering a bit, we realized we needed to turn left.
- > We continued our hike to the "White Pine Picnic Area" according to the map and some signage. But the sign at the picnic area states "High Country".
- > There were markers along the way with letters, but we were not sure what they meant.
- > The trails appeared less used up in the high country. I expect it to be difficult to follow/identify the trail all the way in a couple of months due to overgrowth.
- > We thought trailhead signage would be helpful at all the in and out points Include mileage/elevation markers. I do not see Hart Loop on the map.
- > Sign at the corner of Paramount and Water Canyon Campground is laying on the ground.

Pool Projects: DP
