Due to severe drought conditions, the BVS Gun Range will be closed for fire season, beginning immediately. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, the Tehachapi area and 95% of Kern County are rated at “D4 exceptional drought”, which is the most severe drought category. Daily temps at the Gun Range are regularly reaching 100+ degrees, with low humidity and breezy conditions. Other reasons compound the need to close the range, but the main issue is extreme fire danger. The BVS Gun Range will re-open in the fall months when we start to see precipitation again, and when the daily temps begin to drop.

The main activity center for the valley, the Whiting Center offers an indoor Jacuzzi, a basketball court, (which also doubles as an inline hockey rink), a game room, a fitness center, and different types of exercise classes are also available. Hollywood Through the Looking Glass: My Adventures in Wonderland
Dan Bronson

Hollywood, love it or hate it, is an inescapable presence in all our lives. If you are among the many who have wondered what it would be like to be part of that world, you should join us for the *Insights* presentation by local resident Dan Bronson, who left his position as a university professor and moved to Hollywood to embark on a career as Hollywood story analyst, story editor and writer/producer. Learn how the business of filmmaking changed what he calls his "naïve, college-professor perspective on film as art" and led him to the real-world discovery that "Movies is money." Share his frustration with the development and production of his acclaimed HBO/Ed Harris film, *The Last Innocent Man*, and his joy in the making of *Death of a Cheerleader*, the highest rated television movie in the year it first aired.

Bronson earned his doctorate at Princeton and taught English, American Literature, and Film at Indiana's DePauw University. His Hollywood career included work in various capacities on *Witness*, *Pretty in Pink*, *Top Gun*, *Young Sherlock Holmes*, *Godfather III*, *Hear No Evil*, *Die Hard: With a Vengeance*, and many others. The author of a comic memoir he calls *Confessions of a Hollywood Nobody* and of the hard-boiled mystery *Someone To Watch Over Me*, Bronson lives in Bear Valley Springs with his wife, photographer Sonja Bronson.






BVS Historical Society

Have you ever wondered what those star formations are? Want to be able to navigate by the stars? Or have a telescope sitting in the closet that you'd love to know how to use? Or need help deciding what type to buy? The new Bear Valley Springs Astronomy Club is here to help!

The BVSAC has been formed to bring together interested people to enjoy the beautiful night skies of our valley. The Club is open to people at every level – from complete beginners to astronomy professionals. We plan to have regular

meetings and star parties, and numerous public events throughout the year. We also want to educate our residents about the advantages of keeping our skies naturally dark. We have already joined the International Observe the Moon Night (OTMN) event, so will be setting up telescopes on the Whiting Center lawn on Saturday Oct 16th. We will have an information table and signup sheet at the event. Please note that the observance of published Covid-19 safety procedures will be required for participation in any club event.

We have secured the Equestrian Center Lounge on the first Monday of each month for our general meetings. Our first General Meeting will be on November 1st at 6pm. There's a huge variety of things the Club may do, depending on the interests of the membership. At the first meeting we will talk about things the Club can choose to do, either right from the start, or as long-term goals.
