At our monthly RAC meeting, Phonda Arbolanto brought this request to the Committee for review from the Pickleball Club. A motion was made by Will Handley and 2nd by Kimberly Clow. We voted unanimously to be in agreement with the Pickleball Court Rules as presented. The new court surface is wonderful and the workmanship is incredible so the desire is to keep this integrity of the Pickleball Court surface. These rules correspond with the Tennis Court Rules that are already in place. It is our recommendation that 2 signs be made ASAP for the Pickleball Courts.

In addition, the current Tennis Court Rules that are a part of the BVSA documents would have the change of working from Tennis Court Rules to "Racquet Sports Rules".

COURTS ARE FOR PICKLEBALL PLAY ONLY. NO OTHER ACTIVITIES ALLOWED.

NO FOOD OR BEVERAGES ALLOWED, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF WATER IN NON- BREAKABLE CONTAINERS.

PLAYERS MUST WEAR NON-MARKING COURT SHOES.

PLEASE DO NOT SIT OR SWING ON THE GATES OR NET CABLES.

WHEN OTHERS ARE WAITING, PLEASE LIMIT PLAY TO 1 HOUR. TIME BEGINS FROM POSSESSION OF THE COURT.

BVSA RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE PROPOSAL

October 6, 2021

At our October monthly meeting of the Recreation Advisory Committee, Wes Shryock shared with the Committee 3 different proposals for future Recreation needs for our BVSA community. At this meeting Debbie Papac the Recreation Manager and Joe Horswell the Assistant Recreation Manager were in attendance, as well as the Recreation Committee Members.

The three proposals that have been discussed in the past and now at this meeting were:

1. Updating and adding to the Playground Equipment at the Whiting Center, Cub Lake, 4 Island Lake and specifically at Beaubien Field adding a circular concrete path for tricycles and strollers with the interior of this area being a Par Workout Course and Playground.
2. Building a Sport Complex Pavilion at the Northeast corner of Beaubien Field. This would allow sports to be played all year around. It would free up the Whiting Center for other sports, community meetings and adult classes.
3. Build a lap pool. The current BVSA pool is completely booked and impacted all summer and more space is needed for lap swimming, swim lessons, swim team practice, water therapy and aerobics.

The committee unanimously voted for the Sports Complex Pavilion as the most needed Recreation entity for the Bear Valley Springs membership.

- Fred Hicks said that plans are made for a Cub Lake drain to be installed on the asphalt path by the BB Court to help with water drainage during the rainy season.

3) **RC Modelers-Tom Papac-Is there a timeline when the water line will be run from Beaubien Field to the trees, Horse water trough and RC Modelers track?** **None at this time**

- Would be nice to get a picnic table at the RC track viewing area. Update is that we are putting into the budget for next year to purchase 4 recycled plastic tables for the Model Facility. Until then, the plan is to move one of the wood ones from Water Canyon Campground when we do our major clean up there. If any are in really good shape we will place it on the viewing area.

4) **Sportsman Club** Will Handley- Report on Sportsman BBQ:

This is one of the Club's major events each year and this year a number of changes to the arrangements were forced on us by external factors such as the Mountain Festival in Tehachapi causing us to change the date from August 21st to

September 11th the next available “window” at Cub Lake to avoid conflicting events. *This later date made it possible to use the shade from the trees at Cub Lake eliminating the need for tents and making it more of an outdoor event.* I think it is safe to say this worked well and the **BBQ was a great success. We had over 130 people attending, including 54 new members and guests.**

The Pit, with its new griddle performed as planned and disgorged a large quantity of beautifully cooked beef, pork and turkey, which were duly served with coleslaw, beans and bread rolls with cookies to follow. The bar served a wide range of drinks to meet all thirsts whilst the band, “Alex and the All Stars” played a great selection of music for our enjoyment. Our thanks go to all who helped prepare, cook and serve the food as well as those, who set up the event and cleared everything away afterwards. Going to Reagan Library for the FBI exhibit.
