

Competition Information

- Competitors who have not completed the 2022 Range Safety Rules test will need to do this. This must be done in advance at the Whiting Center. You can take the Test and get your 2022 Range Safety Sticker at the Whiting Center. You will not be able to take the test at the Range.
- All Shooters and spectators must wear eye protection at all times whilst in the firing point areas when firing is taking place.
- There will be a full briefing for competitors on the range on the day of the shoot. This will cover the courses of fire and safety arrangements
- Allow yourself plenty of time to drive to the range remember it takes at least 30 minutes to drive to the range from the bottom of Deer Trail.




