I. Informational Updates		
A. Equestrian Manager's Report	A. Wesley commented that Butch's services to the Equestrian Center have been finalized and he is thrilled to be enjoying the Idaho sun. He then spoke of the process to obtain a new equestrian center manager whose responsibilities will be solely the Equestrain Center and not to include trails. The candidate selected must demonstrate a strong customer service skill as it is important to have fair, consistent policies. Several members of the EAC committee were selected for a panel interview. It was unanimously recommended to offer Luis Benitez, the current assistant manager the position. A new assistant manager as well as trail manager hava not yet been selected.	
B) MPS	Committee was not needed in 2021. Will be considered in 2022 after placement of assistant manager.	
C) KITCHEN UPDATE/BATHROOM UPDATE	C). Wesley had stated that after completion of Mulligan Pavilion, the equestrian campground bathrooms as well as the Buckaroo kitchen will be revamped.
