The effort and attention to detail that go into an event like this was a credit to the men's club and its officers. I was a participant in an after event called the "horse race" in which





# Meet three of Bear Valley's best catfishermen

### Lake Quality Advisory Committee (LQAC)

On July 29, I had the pleasure of taking out three of Bear Valley's best young catfishermen, Walker Flemming (Yoda), Owen Flemming (Monkeybutt), and Sullivan Mountjoy (Terminator) for an afternoon of fishing, and fish surveying on Cub Lake. This summer, these three anglers have harvested more than 1,000 catfish, totaling over 300 lbs., combined. This weight accounts for just about 20% of our yearly harvest goal when our fishery is in balance. As community harvest is a key part of the ongoing management plan to maintaining and keeping our fishery in balance, it is important that the LQAC keeps Bear Valley residents interested and participating in our ongoing catfish derbies. One way to keep this interest is to have awesome prizes.

The initial guided outing idea was hatched when the LQAC was looking for ways to provide prizes for BVS resident kids/grandkids that wouldn't incur costs to the BVSA membership. A half-day guided fishing trip costs in excess of \$350 and since this time was donated, it was decided that this type of outing on Cub Lake would be the "grand prize" for



the July 4th Catfish Derby. In addition to being a phenomenal experience for the winners, it would also provide the LQAC insight regarding the largemouth bass population within Cub Lake.

With the gauntlet having been thrown, it was up to these three young catfisherman to rise to the challenge. They definitely rose to

and blew by the LQAC's expectations. Over the July 4th weekend, this group showed their angling prowess and caught 325 bullhead catfish. This equates to approximately 110 lbs. of fish. With their prize won, it was then up to me to arrange, and schedule, the 1st Cub Lake Trophy Bass Outing.

# How to stay warm without electricity

Whether it's a Public Safety Power Shutdown, seasonal Santa Ana winds, or a severe winter storm, power outages can coincide with cold temperatures. Children, infants, and the elderly are the most at-risk for hypothermia, but it can affect anyone when ambient temperatures drop to 50 degrees Fahrenheit. How can we stay safe, warm, and heat our homes without electricity?

There are no regulations against using fireplaces and wood-burning stoves during PSPS events, but there is a need for common sense. These appliances can be safely used, even during high winds, provided they are well maintained. A chimney fire in high-wind conditions could be devastating, and we have 2-3 chimney fires each year here in Bear Valley Springs. Proper fireplace maintenance and fire hazard abatement measures are vital to your safety and that of our whole community.

- DO have your fireplace or woodstove and chimney cleaned and inspected yearly
- DO clear your gutters, clean pine needles and leaves from your roof, and trim any overhanging branches
- DO keep your weeds cut in the required defensible space around your structures all year long.
- DO make sure you have a spark arrestor installed on your chimney.
- DO dispose of ashes in a closed metal container that is stored outside, at least 10 feet from nearby structures

DON'T – burn treated wood, milled lumber, glossy paper, plastic, or trash

DON'T – start a fire with gasoline, lighter fluid, or other flammable liquids

DON'T - burn wet or "green"

wood that could cause a chimney fire (These fires account for 75% of home heating fires)

# Staying Warm - Safety First

- Carbon Monoxide (CO2) poisoning is the most significant risk. All combustion appliances emit CO2 when used.
- Never use a gas stove or oven to provide heat.
- Test your CO2 detectors monthly and replace batteries promptly.
- Any combustible heat source larger than a single-wick candle should be vented. If you use an unvented heater, cross-ventilate by opening a window an inch on each side of the room. It's better to let in a little cold air than to risk poisoning your family with CO2.
- Keep firefighting materials on hand. These include fire extinguishers, a heavy wool blanket, sand, salt, baking soda, and water.
- Keep all combustible materials at least three feet away from any heat source.
- Ensure that your fireplace or wood-burning stove are correctly maintained by both:
- Having your stove and chimney cleaned and inspected yearly
- Ensuring that there is a spark arrestor in place on your chimney
- Never burn treated wood, milled lumber, glossy paper, or trash in your fireplace or woodstove. These materials can lead to chimney fires.
- When using any combustible heat source, open a nearby window one inch for ventilation.

### **Conserve Body Heat**

The first step is to layer your clothing. You can add or remove layers depending on your comfort level. If you start sweating, immediately shed layers, so you stay dry.



# **BVS Wildfire Response Plan created**

Last October, the Board of Directors of the Bear Valley Community Services District charged the Disaster Preparedness Advisory Council (DPAC) with the task of creating a Wildfire Response Plan (Plan). DPAC completed their assignment and the Plan, along with six recommendations, was presented to the BVCSD BoD. The Plan was approved, along with a charge directing the General Manager

to begin implementation. The Plan and the recommendations can be found at: https://thebvexchange.com/wildfire

The Plan is BVS resident focused. It is not meant to be a step-by-step wildfire response script for how the CSD will respond to a wildfire emergency. Rather, it is a road map BVS residents can utilize to prepare for and respond to a wildfire event in the Valley.

The Plan is broken down into an introduction, followed by five steps:

1 - Pre-Disaster Preparation

- 2 Notification
- 3 Resident Relocation/Zones
- 4 Resident Evacuation
- 5 Post Disaster.

In addition to the Plan, there are six recommendations DPAC presented to the BVCSD BoD. These recommendations are the first steps toward improving the Plan and improving BVS residents' ability to successfully negotiate a wildfire event.

The Plan is meant to be a living document. It will be reviewed and improved as recommendations are implemented and additional changes are needed.

Read the Plan, implement the preparation recommendations, and acquaint yourself with the steps you need to take in an emergency. This will significantly improve your and your family's ability to limit the possibility of the loss of property and life.

On the afternoon of July 29, I met these three young anglers at Cub Lake and presented them with their lure prizes. The lure colors became these angler nicknames for our afternoon adventure. Walker Flemming, the oldest, was given a (Yoda) color Whopper Plopper; Sullivan Mountjoy, having caught the most catfish during the July 4th weekend, was given a (Terminator) color Whopper Plopper; and Owen Flemming was given a (Monkey Butt) color Whopper Plopper. We started the day with two rules: stay in the boat, and don't hook anyone. With nicknames secured, life jackets donned, and ground rules established, we proceeded to head out onto the lake for our afternoon adventure.

We began by fishing topwater lures for the first hour on the lake. Unfortunately, the fish wanted no part of the topwater action, but the boys did manage to hook some really big trees along the island. We then switched to spinnerbaits and soft plastic swimbaits for the next couple of hours. We were able to land a few crappies, one bluegill, and a massive clump of algae, but the Largemouth Bass continued to evade us. Walker (Yoda) proved to be the best caster among them, only hooking one tree. Sullivan Bear Tracks

(Terminator) was definitely the lure changer, as I changed baits for him about every five to ten minutes. Owen (Monkey Butt) was the rule pusher (in a good laughable way) and overall, definitely the most excitable. At one point, I think Monkey Butt only had one of four appendages in the boat. By days end, I think we ended with 9 or 10 boat rules.

As we fished through the afternoon, the boys continued to hook some monster trees, so for the sake of my sanity, we decided that we would troll for the remainder of the evening. I tied on shallow running jerkbaits and explained to the trio how to effectively fish them, and we began trolling. The bite was slow. We caught and landed a few more crappie and then in the last hour of the day, our luck finally changed.

After being instructed once again by Owen (Monkey Butt) that I should turn the boat around and go yet another different direction, he finally hooked up to a monster largemouth bass. Owen fought the monster fish for about five minutes, with the fish constantly taking out drag from the reel. I helped Owen hold the rod and fight the fish, as the monster was powerful enough so that Monkey Butt was having a hard time controlling it. I needed to help Monkey Butt, not because he wasn't strong enough, but because he was just so excited that he wasn't sure what to do with the giant fish pulling on the end of his line. The big fish finally came to the surface after about three minutes into the battle and I was able to see it was at least a seven pound plus largemouth bass. The beast dove back to the bottom and continued the fight for another couple of minutes. We finally got the giant fish to the boat and being the smart old timer that she was, she made a final dive for the bottom and shook the hooks just under the boat. This is why they call it fishing and not catching. You can do everything right and still lose a fish right next to the boat. Owen handled the disappointment like a champ. He immediately went back to instructing me how to drive the boat and telling me to take him to where the fish were.

Unfortunately, we never landed a trophy Largemouth Bass, but we were better able to understand the Largemouth Bass population within Cub Lake. In regards to the science education aspect of our adventure, I explained to the trio and their parents/grandparents how angling plays a part in Catch Per Unit Effort studies (CPUE), and how the outing that day helped the LQAC better understand the makeup of the fish population within Cub Lake. CPUE is the amount of effort required to catch a number of fish over a certain amount of time. The LQAC has set a goal of two fish per hour as our target. This means that on average, in three hours of fishing, you should catch six fish of the species you're targeting. Unfortunately, our CPUE was very low as we only hooked one largemouth bass in 16.5 hours of angling time. This means the largemouth bass population within Cub Lake needs some help, or I'm a horrible guide. Either way it was still a great day with a lot of laughs and great memories established. The boys were already planning on how they would go about catching 350+ catfish during the next derby so they could win the top spot once again. The LQAC will continue to look at, improve, and study the fish population within Cub Lake.

Overall, it was a great experience and one that I will remember for the rest of my life. No one got hooked, and with 27 hooks being flung around a boat by three young anglers, that in itself is quite a feat. No lures were left in any trees during the entire outing, although I did have to get wet a few times to get them free. Hopefully, I was able to teach the trio a few things about fishing and science. They also taught me what the definition of a Karen is. I'm looking forward to my next outing with Yoda, Terminator, and Monkey Butt.

laver (underwear laver): Long underwear and wool socks were made for this - you want a thin, snug-fitting fabric that will wick sweat away from your skin.

- 2. A thin mid-layer: shirts and pants. This layer provides insulation and traps body heat so pay attention to fit. You don't want this layer to be too tight or too loose. Wool is an ideal fabric for this layer. You can layer thick socks over thin socks as well.
- 3. Insulation layer: This layer is for warmth for sedentary activities or frigid temperatures. You want garments that are lofty. A puffy coat or a thick sweater is ideal. Make sure your shoes or boots are roomy too.
- 4. Outer shell: Studies conducted by Recreational Equipment Co-op show that a wind shell worn over any garment can add up to 25 degrees of warmth in still air. You want a fabric that is wind-proof but not waterproof so that perspiration can escape easily.
- 5. Head protection: a stocking cap or beanie will help to keep you toasty in the coldest conditions.

If you're still cold, layering with blankets can help. This is an excellent opportunity to snuggle and spend quality time with loved ones and pets.

## **Space heaters**

First, choose a room to be heated. Try to select a room on the "warm" side of the house away from prevailing winds. Avoid rooms with large windows and isolate the room from the rest of the house by keeping doors closed. If you are using a ventless combustion (propane or kerosene) space heater, open a nearby window one inch to provide ventilation. If you have a generator for emergency power and you're using an electric space heater, use the shortest possible heavy-duty cord of 14-gauge or larger wire. Ensure the fumes will not enter the house, your neighbor's home, or another building.

### **Vented Gas Fireplace**

These modern fireplaces use a sealed combustion system that is vented to the outside, achieving 65-70% heating efficiency in the room where they are located. During a PSPS, the electric ignition and blower fan will not work, but they can still generate heat. Consult your appliance manufacturer or installation technician for guidance on how to operate the fireplace without electricity.

### **Wood Burning Fireplace**

Wood-burning fireplaces are less than ideal. With an efficiency rating of 10%, you lose 90% of your heat up the chimney. The air currents created by the draft pull cold air into the house through windows, reducing your home's overall temperature. If this is your only heat source, try to isolate the room by keeping doors closed and hanging bedding or drapes over open entryways. It seems contradictory, but you will still need to open a window one inch to avoid CO2 poisoning. Ensure that the space in front and around the fireplace is clear of combustibles such as rugs or dog beds. Never leave a wood-burning fireplace unattended or burning overnight; embers can escape into the room and start a house

## **Wood Burning Stoves**

Wood burning stoves are the most efficient way to heat your home without electricity. The catalytic wood stoves required in California typically have an 80-90% efficiency rating. They are designed to burn off the smoke and ash before they vent to the outside, reducing both emissions and the risk of live embers exiting the chimney. The stoves are also designed to be fired with the doors closed, reducing drafts, gasses entering the home, and eliminating the risk of embers escaping into the house. Proper maintenance is a must, with yearly cleaning and chimney inspections to reduce a chimney fire risk. Wood stoves also offer a way to cook or reheat food during a power outage. Cast iron or stainless-steel cookware can be used to heat water for coffee and reheat frozen soups, stews, and one-pot dinners.

Like most emergencies, a little preparedness goes a long way. Take a look at your home today and decide what rooms will be the "warm" rooms. Ensure you have the blankets or doors to trap the heat. Decide which windows will be opened that one inch to prevent CO2 poisoning.

You will also want to make sure that the chimneys are inspected and cleaned, and that leaves, pine needles, and other debris are cleared from the roof and gutters. Keep the weeds and overhanging branches trimmed. Ensure your firewood is kept safely and in dry conditions but not against the house.



# Ten tips to prepare for winter

Autumn is a prelude to

falling winter temperatures, regardless of where you live. Here are 10 tips to prepare your home for winter:

- 1. Furnace Inspection
- Call an HVAC professional to inspect your furnace and clean ducting.
- Stock up on furnace filters and change them monthly
- Consider upgrading your thermostat to a programmable thermostat
- Remove all flammable materials from the area surrounding your furnace

# 2. Fireplace/Stove Inspection & Preparation

- Check the spark arrestor on the chimney and ensure it is in place
- Call a chimney sweep to clean and service your fireplace or woodstove
- Buy firewood. Keep it stored in a dry location away from your home

# 3. Check Exterior Doors and Windows

- Inspect the exterior of your home for crevices, cracks, and exposed entry points around pipes, and seal them. Prime and paint any exposed wood
- Use weather stripping around doors to prevent cold air from entering the home
- Check the caulk on your windows
- Replace cracked glass in windows
- Switch out summer screens with glass replacements/storm windows

# 4. Inspect Roof, Gutters & Downspouts

- Check and consider adding extra insulation to your attic spaces. Insulation will prevent warm air loss through your roof.
- Check flashing to ensure that water cannot enter the home
- Replace worn or missing roof shingles and tiles

## 5. Service Weather-Specific Equipment

- Drain gas from lawnmowers, weed trimmers, leaf blowers, and other equipment
- Give snow-blowers a pre-season tune-up
- Replace worn rakes and snow shovels

SMALL STEPS TOWARD BEING PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY

# **Be Informed**



THE GOAL: Make sure everyone in your household can receive, understand, and act on information received in an emergency.

Getting correct information during an emergency is the key to taking safe action. Someone in your household may not be able to receive, understand, or act on emergency information. Think about what special needs your household may have. Take action now to make sure everyone in your family will be safe in an emergency.

DDD CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING THINGS TO DO THIS MONTH TO BECOME BETTER PREPARED:

Make sure everyone in your family knows what to do when they hear emergency warnings.

Your community may have outdoor warning sirens (also called tornado sirens) to warn you in an emergency. These sirens are meant to let people who are outside know they should go indoors. When you hear the outdoor warning sirens sound in your area it is not safe for you to be outdoors. You should take cover inside a sturdy building and get more information from television, radio, internet, or by contacting a friend or family member.

Call your local fire department to find out if your area is covered by warning sirens, when they are tested, and when they would be activated. Make sure other members of your household know what to do when outdoor warning sirens sound.

Some communities have other ways of warning residents. They may call by phone, or send text messages or emails with emergency information. Check with your local emergency management or sheriff's office to find out what other warning systems are used in your area. Talk to family members about what to do when emergency information is given.

- Clean, dry, and store summer gardening equipment
- Stock up on ice melt, and sand or kitty litter

### 6. Check Foundations

- Rake all debris and vegetation away from your foundation to make inspection easier
- Seal up entry points to keep insects and small animals from entering the home
- Tuck-point or seal foundation cracks. Mice and slip through a space as thin as a dime
- Inspect sill plates for dry rot and pest infestation

# 7. Service Smoke and Co2 Detectors

- Buy extra batteries and change them when daylight savings ends
- Make sure there are carbon monoxide detectors installed near your furnace and water heater
- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are working
- Buy a fire extinguisher or replace old fire extinguishers

# 8. Prevent Plumbing Freezes

- Locate your water shutoffs, one where water comes into the home and the control valve at your meter. You will need to know where these are in the event of a burst pipe.
- Drain all garden hoses and irrigation systems
  - Insulate exposed plumbing
- Drain air conditioner pipes, and if your AC has a water shut-off valve, turn it off.
- If you plan to leave for several days, set your thermostat to a minimum of 55\*

# 9. Prepare Landscaping & Outdoor Surfaces

- Trim trees if branches are hanging close to the house, over the roof, or close to electrical wires.
- Ask a gardener when your trees should be pruned to prevent winter injury
- Plant spring bulbs and lift bulbs that cannot winter over
- Seal driveways, brick pati-Bear Tracks

os, and wood decks

• Move sensitive potted plants to a sheltered indoor area

## 10. Prepare an Emergency Kit

• Buy battery-powered lanterns and flashlights to use in case of a power outage

- Buy a battery back-up to protect your computer and sensitive electronics from sudden shutdowns
- Store extra bottled water and non-perishable food supplies, blankets, clothing, and first-aid supplies. Keep enough on hand to last 7-10 days and keep it in an easily

accessible location

# ☐ Get a NOAA Emergency Alert Radio.

Weather can change very quickly. Severe weather may strike when people are sleeping or unaware of the forecast. This can be deadly if people do not seek a safe shelter. A NOAA emergency alert radio (sometimes called a weather radio) can turn itself on when an emergency alert is issued and warn you at any time - day or night.

Emergency alert radios can also be used to warn about other emergencies, such as a chemical spill. With the Emergency Alert Radio, you will be warned about dangerous situations in time to take shelter or other safe action.

Every home should have an emergency alert radio, just the way all homes should have a smoke detector. They can be purchased at stores that sell electronics. Prices start at about \$20.00. Most run on batteries or have battery back-up.

# Make sure everyone in your household can communicate in a disaster.

The way emergency information is sent out in your community may not work for everyone. If you don't speak English well, or if you use an assistive device to speak or hear, make a plan now. Make sure you can get and give information in a disaster.


Communities may give information by television or radio, by automated phone call, text messages, email, or by sounding outdoor warning sirens. Police or fire may use loudspeakers to give information as they drive through the streets. Responders or volunteers may go door-to-door to talk to people directly.

If you think you may not be able to understand emergency information, identify someone (or more than one person) that you can contact for help in an emergency. Have more than one way to get in touch with them. Keep their contact information with you.

### Emergency Information: Things to consider...

- . Emergency news or weather broadcasts may not be close captioned.
- . Information that is shown on screen may not be spoken aloud.
- Automated voices and voices over loud speakers may be hard to understand.
- Information comes quickly and the stress of a disaster may make it hard to understand or remember instructions.
- . Words moving across the bottom of a television screen may move very quickly.
- . The screen color or color of the text might make some information on television hard to read.

### TEXT OF PROPOSED CHANGES to ECC RULES

(Deletions are shown in strikethrough type and additions in boldface underlined type)

SECTION 100. Land Use The following provisions shall apply to the use of all residential lots subject to these Rules. [C&Rs, Para. 4 and 7a]

A. Residential Use. No residential lot, condominium lot or condominium shall be used for other than residential purposes. Short-term rentals or leases (less than 6 months thirty consecutive days in length at any one time) negatively impact Association resources, resulting in undue costs and liability for the Association, and therefore are disallowed. This includes Air BNB's, VRBO, or any other vacation, weekend or short-term rentals. (Amended 07/10/18)

### **Purpose and Effect of Proposed Changes**

We have been advised by legal counsel that state law supersedes BVSA & ECC Rules in the matter of minimum length of a rental. This rule change is to keep us in compliance with current state laws.




