Bear Valley Community Services District Fire Hydrant Maintenance Program

The BVCSD fire hydrant maintenance program follows the American Water Works Association (AWWA) Manual M17, Fire Hydrants: Installation, Field Testing, and Maintenance. We currently inspect and maintain a total of 653 Fire Hydrants throughout Bear Valley Springs.

Due to freezing temperatures in the wintertime, we only utilize dry-barrel fire hydrants. The dry-barrel hydrants, as described in the AWWA Manual M17, get their name from the fact that water is drained or pumped from the barrel when the hydrant is not in use. In a dry-barrel hydrant, a single main valve is located in the base of the hydrant adjacent to the inlet connection. In addition, the dry-barrel hydrant is equipped with an automatically operated drain valve. When the main valve is closed, the drain valve automatically opens, draining all water from the barrel of the hydrant. When the hydrant is opened, the drain valve automatically closes. The main valve is located below the normal frost line to protect the hydrant from freezing.

Maintenance and Inspection per the AWWA Manual M17. To ensure that a hydrant will work correctly when it is needed, a periodic testing and maintenance program must be followed. Although hydrants are operated by members of the Fire Department, it is generally the water utility's responsibility to maintain them in working order. Inspection: All hydrants should be inspected regularly, at least once a year, to ensure their satisfactory operation.

In August of 2024, to comply with AWWA Manual M17 for fire hydrant maintenance and inspection, we created a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP), a Hydrant Maintenance Checklist, and a Fire Hydrant repair work order form (if needed) that our water team diligently follows.

Our water department is extremely busy with daily operations, including fixing water leaks. However, we are still committing time every month for fire hydrant maintenance and inspections. January 2025 started our new annual inspection cycle, and as of 5/30/2025, we have inspected 253 out of the 653 fire hydrants in Bear Valley Springs. We are on track to complete inspections of all 653 fire hydrants by the end of 2025. In addition to our water department conducting annual inspections and maintenance, the Kern County Fire Department Station 16 also conducts its annual inspections of all 653 fire hydrants throughout Bear Valley Springs.

Using our Fire Hydrant SOP and Maintenance Checklist, our Water Department personnel perform the inspection of each fire hydrant. Once the fire hydrant is fully inspected, our team will hang a metal

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



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

All youth under the age of 13 are required to wear a life jacket any time they are floating or riding on any type of vessel in the lake, including kayaks, paddleboards, inner tubes, and rafts. requirement enforced by the United States Coast Guard to help prevent tragic accidents on the water.

Drowning can occur quickly and without warning, even in calm or familiar environments. Ensuring that children wear a properly fitted, Coast Guard-approved life jacket every time they're on the lake is a simple but powerful way to protect their lives. 

- DO NOT move the patio furniture!
- Only authorized swimwear that is commercially sold will be allowed in the pool—no cut-off pants or shorts.
- NO Thong Bikinis or Speedo type briefs allowed; must wear appropriate pool attire.
- Each member 9 or older must show their Amenity Card and have the 2025 release of liability sticker at the pool gate.
- Ice chests, coolers, and similar containers shall not be brought into the pool area. However, they can be left outside the gate. (BVSA Rule 1103)
- Bringing alcoholic beverages into the pool area is prohibited.
- NO SMOKING IN THE POOL AREA: THIS INCLUDES VAPING.
- NO running, horseplay, or roughhousing in the pool area is allowed.
- NO flips, twists, or jumping backward into the pool is allowed.
- NO squirt guns, water balloons, hard balls, rafts, recreational type flotation devices, diving into the shallow end, sitting on shoulders, climbing on rocks, or running in the pool area.
- . NO vulgar or profane language in the pool area.
- A responsible adult must accompany children 13 and under, if they are 14 or older, please bring your children to the gate to ensure they are admitted. (BVSA Rule 1102c).
- A maximum pool capacity of 93 in water will be in effect, with a deck capacity of 150.
- Guests will be charged a \$5 guest fee per day AND MUST BE
 ACCOMPANIED BY A PROPERTY OWNER. There is a limit of 3 guests
 per Track/Lot 13 years old and older. There is a limit of 3 guests per
 Track/Lot 12 and under. Children 5-12 are \$3; children 4 and under are
 free. Amenity Passes (without the resident) will NOT be honored.
- All swimmers may be required to prove their ability to swim.
 Lifeguards may administer a swim test at any time to anyone under the age of 10.
- Property Owners must be in good standing to enter the pool area.
 Health Breaks, which comists of a 10-minute rest period for children 13 and under, requires that they are completely out of the water. This includes the baby pool. These will be enforced every hour on the hour, and only potrons 14 and up can swim during these 10 minutes. These breaks may be more frequent if capocity is reached.





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BVS evacuation routes and refuge points

As we enter the summer months, please review and save a copy of the Bear Valley Springs Evacuation Routes and Refuge Points.

Bear Valley has three evacuation routes: through the main gate, on Deertrail Drive, and on Skyline Drive. The Deertrail and Skyline evacuation routes cross private land and have locked gates. When those routes are activated by emergency services, a code for those locks will be sent to the community via

Nixle (https://www.bvcsd.org/nixle) as well as our website, social media, and the Emergency Radio Team (https://www.bvcsd.org/posts/disaster-preparedness-the-bvs-emergency-radio-team).

Those routes are marked with "Evacuation Route" signage to help guide residents. Please note that the Skyline evacuation route can handle trailers without too much difficulty, but trailers are not recommended on Deertrail. All routes are ac-

cessible to vehicles with twowheel drive.

The Bear Valley Refuge Points are safe places within our community that can be used by residents until it is safe to return to their homes or until authorities facilitate an orderly evacuation outside the valley.

We thank you all for taking the time to review and save this information.

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



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BEAR VALLEY EVACUATION MAPS

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

Why BVS is a good place for astronomy?

Astronomers tend to make good neighbors and are just the type that we want to attract to our community. But why is BVS a good location for Astronomy? The first reason has to be, of course, the BVS Astronomy Club! There are, however, other criteria astronomers look for when choosing a location to pursue astronomy. The chief attributes being good weather, transparency, dark skies (lack of light pollution), and what's known as "good seeing."

Good weather is an obvious. The more clear nights, the more opportunity to observe. Transparency might seem a bit more elusive. The more "transparent" the atmosphere, the more light from faint astronomical targets get through. Humidity, dust, smoke, etc. can scatter light diminishing the target brightness while brightening the surrounding sky. Being away from sources of smog, dust and smoke is helpful. Being at a higher elevation is extremely helpful. BVS ranges from around 4,000 to 6,500'. We look through significantly less atmosphere than the lower elevations and are normally above the Central Valley haze layer and Mojave dust.

The desire for darkness is another obvious. The darker the sky the fainter the astronomical objects - whether it be nebulae, galaxies, asteroids, etc. – that are within your telescope's grasp. Equally obvious is that the darkness is dramatically impacted by the over or inappropriate use of artificial lighting, a.k.a. light pollution.

The good news for astronomers is that BVS has rather good lighting regulations. The bad news is that many don't appear to adhere to the reg. I prefer to believe that they are unaware of their violations and better awareness within our community will help rectify this issue. Enough said.

Lastly, the somewhat obscure term "astronomical seeing". Seeing is how well or poorly the atmosphere preserves image sharpness. Good seeing means that images of the night sky remain sharp and unmoving all the way to the surface. Poor seeing delivers blurred images that can dance about. Many envi-

ronmental factors contribute to seeing but in general, astronomers look for air that's not going to be disturbed by moving over rough terrain or churned up by hot ground. Again, mountains can often be good, something we have in abundance here in BVS.

Taken together, BVS has nupotential to be even better!

into operational status. A large majority of our open work orders are for valve cleaning. What this means is that the fire hydrant is fully functional, but the valve in the valve can which is below the surface in the roadway collects debris including small rocks and dirt. The reason these type of work orders get back logged is due to the requirement of traffic control to get our big vacuum trailer in place to properly clean the valve box.
