


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SESSION ONE



HER STORY

Esther

"If you keep quiet at a time like this, deliverance and relief for the Jews will arise from some other place, but you and your relatives will die. Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?" ESTHER 4:14 (NLT).

grew up as the youngest of two children, in a home where alcohol and abuse were commonplace. When I was eight or nine years old, my father got terribly sick, and eventually passed away from cancer. He was a heavy smoker, so it shouldn't have been surprising, but losing him was a hard thing for me to comprehend at that age. On top of all of that, I was bullied by classmates for various reasons that I had no control over. I dealt with things no child should ever have to deal with and ended up on a path riddled with doubt, depression, and shame in my teenage and early adult years. Any time I attempted to change course, I would often question my ability to make good decisions or advocate for myself, let alone anyone else. In my mind, I was getting exactly what I deserved, so why try to do anything different? It wasn't until I started leaning on God in those moments of uncertainty that I witnessed how He

could move in my life and use me in the lives of others. Seeking God is how Esther came to make her courageous decision to speak up for her people. This one courageous act would have a lasting impact for generations. In spite of her disadvantaged background, she found favor and discovered her purpose.

FINDING IDENTITY

The relatively short, yet significant, story of Esther begins with a tragedy. She becomes an orphan at a young age. My experience tells me how hard it is to grow up without one parent, but both? I can't imagine how difficult that must have been for Esther. Then she, along with many other Jews, had been exiled from their homeland for committing idolatry and disobeying God. It's unlikely that Esther was disobedient. However, sometimes we can suffer the consequences from the poor choices of others. From experience, I can tell you, this comes with a certain level of guilt. Esther found herself living in a foreign land among Gentiles, which basically forced her to hide who she really was so she wouldn't be treated differently. She had many disadvantages in life. But disadvantages can be transformed by the Redeemer as we will see!

FINDING FAVOR

So how did Esther, an impoverished, disadvantaged, Jewish orphan, find herself in the ranks of Gentile royalty? This is the part of the story where we meet Esther's cousin, Mordecai. After the death of her parents, Mordecai raised her as his own. When the position for Queen of Persia *conveniently* opened up, he took Esther to the palace. This was the beginning of a string of events that would eventually lead Esther to the throne.

Esther did not look for favor, nor did she obtain it by her own efforts. She exercised wisdom to submit to Mordecai's judgment and to Hegai's advice.

In preparation for her presentation to King Xerxes, Esther with other young women were gathered and supervised by the king's chief eunuch, Hegai. He was impressed with her and offered her treatment beyond what the other women received. Esther never requested preferential treatment, but it was given to her. When offered her choice of clothing and jewelry, she requested nothing. She went to the king only with what Hegai suggested. When it was Esther's turn, everyone who saw her was delighted in her presence and the king was instantly enamored. He practically declared her queen on the spot! The common theme here is that Esther did not look for favor, nor did she obtain it by her own efforts. She exercised wisdom to submit to Mordecai's judgement and to Hegai's advice. These things exemplify God's redeeming ability to grant unmerited favor to those that exercise humility, as noted in 1 Peter 5:6 (NLT): "So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time he will lift you up in honor."

FINDING PURPOSE

Esther's story doesn't stop there! Soon after taking her place at the throne, she was burdened by another troubling situation. Haman, the king's most trusted (and prideful) advisor, found out from other palace officials that Mordecai was a Jew. After Mordecai refused to bow down to him, an enraged Haman convinced King Xerxes that all Jews should be executed for his protection. Mordecai learned of this plan and disclosed it to Esther, pleading with her to go to the king and stop it. Her immediate response was basically, "No." In those days, anyone who approached the king without being summoned risked death. Esther had not revealed her own Jewish heritage to the king and not even her position as queen exempted her from the consequences.

Mordecai stressed to Esther that if she didn't act, the Jews would eventually be saved, but she and her relatives would not survive. She reconsidered Mordecai's request and called for all Jews to gather and fast for three days. Afterward she

approached the king to spare her life and the lives of her people, finally revealing her own Jewish heritage. And guess what? It didn't even matter. The king had already resolved to give Queen Esther whatever she desired.

With the strong encouragement of her loving cousin, she courageously risked her own life, blocked Haman's evil plan for Jewish genocide, and obtained special protection for all Jews in King Xerxes empire. If Esther had never been chosen as queen, this story would have had a very different outcome. In spite of her initial identity as a disadvantaged poor orphaned Jew, God beautifully redeemed her life and gave her transforming favor that led to His mighty purposes being fulfilled.

LIFE LESSONS:

- 1. FINDING IDENTITY- Your identity is not found in your upbringing, past, or social status. These are irrelevant to God. God had a plan for Esther long before any of her disadvantaged circumstances occurred. Find comfort in this and know the things that happen(ed) won't prevent you from receiving what God has for you. Galatians 3:27 states, "for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." As a follower of Christ, your identity in this world is lost so that you can embrace your identity in Him.
- 2. FINDING FAVOR- It's important to remember that God is always working, whether we can see it or not. Esther's abundance of favor was a clear sign that God was working. The name of God is not mentioned once in Esther's story, but His presence is evident throughout. When we practice humility and trust in God's power instead of our own, the result is redeeming, transforming favor! God's power is at work within us! He is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20 NIV).
- 3. FINDING PURPOSE- God's plan for your life will not always align with your own, nor will it always be easy. It may be downright terrifying, but thankfully you don't have to figure it out alone. We can devote so much time and energy to finding our purpose, but without taking the time to ask God for direction, it will be fruitless. When you find yourself at a pivotal point, do as Esther did; Pray to your Redeemer, and seek support from fellow believers. It's important to remember that God can transform situations

and cause things to work for the good of those who love Him and are called according to His purpose (Romans 8:28, NIV).



Esther 1-10

SIGNATURE: Name

ESTHER [EHS-ter: "star" or "hidden"]

Also known as HADASSAH [huh-DAHS-suh: "myrtle tree"] (Hebrew name).

SETTING: Background

[Date around 483-473 B.C.] The Jewish people had been dispersed and many were in Suza, the capital of the Persian empire. A plan to exterminate the Jews comes to the attention of Esther's cousin Mordecai. God gives Esther favor with the King and places her in a position to be used by God for a divine purpose.

The book of Esther is one of only two books in the bible that does not mention God by name, but that certainly does not mean He was not in control. Esther's redeeming journey to her purpose was one of many indications of God's sovereignty, His ultimate power and authority over EVERYTHING. Redeemed Woman, even when God seems silent, He is present. There is never a moment when He releases control of your story to the destroyer. In every disadvantage that

suggests you will miss out, lose or be left behind, El Elyon, the God is steadily working His purpose in your life with divine precision.

Tun Facts: About Our Girl Queen ESTHER!

- Esther's given queen name means "star" or "hidden." Her Hebrew birth name was Hadassah.
- Esther is King David's great-niece.
- Esther is one of only two women with her own book in the Bible;
 the other is Ruth.
- The name "God" or "Jesus" is never mentioned in the book of Esther, however it is inferred or symbolized throughout the book.
- The Temple was rebuilt about 40 years before queen Esther became queen, and Nehemiah rebuilt the Wall of Jerusalem about 30 years afterward.
- Her marriage to the king must have given Jews great prestige. It is impossible to guess what might have happened to the Hebrew nation had there been no Esther. Except for her, Jerusalem might never have been rebuilt, and with the annihilation of the Jews it would have changed how Christ came into the world to provide ultimate deliverance. Without her there may have been a different story to tell.
