Title: Front Ensemble Coordinator

Description: The Front Ensemble Coordinator is responsible for the educational and administrative oversight of the Madison Scouts front ensemble performers and staff.

Duties:

- Collaborate with the Percussion Caption Head and front ensemble staff to ensure pedagogical approach and staff culture align with the expectations of the Madison Scouts percussion program
- Effectively collaborate with percussion and audio design staff to ensure that all front ensemble performance content is implemented with technical and stylistic accuracy
- Implement performance and leadership education at off-season camps and during the summer tour
- Maintain a safe, engaging, and pedagogically sound performance environment for all front ensemble performers

Qualifications:

- Minimum 21 years of age
- Pass a criminal background check and reference check
- Full COVID-19 vaccination
- Availability to attend winter camps on Nov. 18-20, 2022, Dec. 16-18, 2022, and Apr. 28-30, 2023
- Substantial availability between May 28, 2023 and August 12, 2023
- Candidates with experience teaching world class DCI or WGI organizations are preferred



Additional Information:

- Educational team members will be in a live-in position with the drum corps during the summer tour. Once competition begins the educational team will travel with the drum corps via bus to all performances.
- All participants, staff, and volunteers will be required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 prior to arrival.
