

The Project


The Project consist in the development of a 200MW Combined Cycle Power Plant (CCPP) in Kanbauk, to supply power to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

The new infrastructures will be constructed at the location of the existing 6MW power plant.

Construction is planned to start end of 2017 and operations end of 2020




- April 2013 Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.
- August 2014 Signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) after completing a Feasibility Study.
- March 2016 Signed the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with the Ministry of Electric Power (MOEP).

Impact Assessment

An Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is being undertaken to better understand the likely impacts associated with the project and Project-related activities on the environment and the communities.

The EIA Study is being conducted to satisfy the Myanmar Regulatory requirements and according to International Standards.

The EIA report will be submitted to the Environmental Conservation Department, the Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry for approval.
