Richard, as we called him, was a consummate music lover and performer. Along with his dog, Faszold (named for a character from an opera which Richard loved) and his friends and family, these things represent the things that Richard held most dear. Hence, some of the artifacts that have been applied to his quilt panel concern these things: A picture of Richard with his dog, a dog collar that would have fit Faszold, a copy of his score of Treemonisha, and the front of the tuxedo he wore when he performed with the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra and Chorus. Richard had a rich and beautiful Baritone voice.

Richard never could swim, but wanted badly to visit the beaches of Jamaica before he died. Alas, he never made it to Jamaica (his doctor advised against this kind of travel as his condition worsened) but did manage to go on a road trip to Key West with a few of us, where he learned how to snorkel and swim very late in his life. This to him was a very proud accomplishment. We have applied his snorkel and mask, on which he wrote his name.

Richard was a special gift to our lives and touched many through his appreciation and performance of beautiful music. His other friends and I appreciate the opportunity to remember him with this quilt panel.


