Maybe you're new to handling over-dimensional shipments. Or maybe you've had experience with them, but you are tired of looking all over the place for information on (the many different) state regulations. Either way, we've put together this guide to help you when it comes to navigating the world of heavy haul shipping.

What is considered an over-dimensional shipment?

Regulations vary by state, but typical guidelines to start with in the U.S. are:

- Standard width of highway lane is 12'
- Loads exceeding 8.5' wide are considered oversize and require permitting
- Maximum height limit is from 12.5' to 14.5'
- Generally, loads over 16' wide are considered "super loads" that may require road closures for parts of the move and/or law enforcement escorts or attendees

Terminology

There are several terms you will need to know when discussing over-dimensional shipping. Here are some of the most important:

Conestoga

A specific flatbed trailer that is equipped with a rolling tarp system, which allows for faster, easier tarping of a flatbed or step deck load. Conestoga is the brand name for one of the trailers, though it has become a generic term for these trailers in the industry.

Consignee

The party who the load will be delivered to. Can also be referred to as the receiver.

Corner Protectors

Any of the devices that are used to prevent damage to the edges and corners of bundles of cargo. They are normally somewhat of an L-shape and are typically placed underneath the chains and straps used to secure cargo.

Covered Wagon

Another term for a sidekit.

Dunnage

Material that is used in loading freight that will be unloaded by crane or forklift. It is often made of lumber that is then placed between bundles of lumber or steel. Dunnage provides a space between bundles that will allow a forklift blade to get underneath before lifting. Sometimes other materials like steel or drywall strips will be used as dunnage.

Exclusive Use

An agreement that the use of a trailer hauling a load is dedicated to one shipper. Freight that belongs to other shippers will not be loaded on the trailer. The trailer is exclusively for the one shipper's freight.

Escorts

Vehicles that assist in the movement of over-dimensional loads. They make sure the truck has plenty of space to move by alerting other drivers of the oversized load. They may also help stop traffic when needed.

Heavy Haul

Another term used for the movement of over-dimensional loads.

Legal Loads

Loads that are not over-dimensional and that meet the height, width, length, and weight requirements for their routes traveled.

LTL

An abbreviation for less-than-truckload. These are partial loads that can be combined with other shipments to save costs for all shippers involved.

Open Deck

A classification of trailers that are characterized by an open deck and are not enclosed. These include flatbeds, step decks, and RGNs. They are often used to haul items such as machinery, equipment, steel, lumber, drywall, and other construction materials.

Over-dimensional Loads

Loads that exceed the allowable height, weight, length, or width limits. These loads may require permits, escorts, signage, and have various restrictions on their travel.

Oversize Loads

Another term for over-dimensional loads.

Patial Loads

Shipments that do not require the full deck space of a trailer. Often these can be combined with other partial loads to reduce costs on shipping freight. Another term for LTL loads.

Permitted Loads

Another term for over-dimensional loads.

Pilot Vehicles

Another term for escorts.

Sidekit

A flatbed trailer that is equipped with fiberglass or plywood panels mounted in a vertical fashion giving it a side body effect. This allows for shipments that are not crated or packaged. Examples of these of loads are watermelons, scrap metal, or engine blocks.

Straps

Vinyl material used to secure and tie down freight on a trailer.

Super load

This is a load that exceeds a state's over-dimensional permit limits. These loads often require law enforcement escorts and road closures during travel.

Tarp

A large piece of heavy vinyl fabric that is used on unenclosed trailers to protect the freight from the elements and road grime.

V Boards


A type of flexible corner protector made from lumber and nylon straps. It is placed on the edges of brick cubes to keep bricks secure during transit.

Equipment types

If you're a shipper working with over-dimensional shipments, you'll need to know what type of equipment you need to move your freight. Here are some handy infographics and descriptions of the type of equipment that transports this type of freight:


FLATBED

A flatbed is a type of trailer that has a long floor and is not enclosed. There's more freedom with this type of trailer because commodities, like building materials, don't have to fit within the confines of a normal enclosed trailer.




STRETCH FLATBED

If your freight is longer than typical flatbed freight maximums, there are stretch flatbeds. They're just as they sound, with the capability to extend lengthwise through a sliding mechanism on the cargo bed.




STEP DECK [OR DROP DECK]

A step-deck or drop-deck trailer is similar to a flatbed but offers two different levels to accommodate for equipment that is taller than the 8.5-foot height maximum for a flatbed trailer. If you are shipping tractors, machinery, or freight that is over 9 'tall, you should look into a drop-deck.




STRETCH STEP DECK

This is like a typical step deck trailer, except it has the ability to extend from 38' to 60' on the main deck with the use of a sliding mechanism. This works best for tall and extra-long freight.




DOUBLE DROP

A double drop trailer is designed for freight that is over 10 'tall. Height of a double drop can vary from 18" to 24" from the ground up.




STRETCH DOUBLE DROP

A stretch double drop trailer has the ability to stretch within the well portion, extending from 29' to 50'.




REMOVABLE GOOSENECK [RGN]

Removable goosenecks are for equipment that needs to be driven on and off of the flatbed, for example heavy machinery, or oversized cargo. It's essentially a double drop with a detachable deck, also known as a lowboy.



LOWBOY

A lowboy trailer has two drops in the height deck after the gooseneck and right before the wheels. Lowboys often carry large industrial equipment since the deck is able to hang lower to the ground than other trailers.



Securement

If your freight is not secured correctly when transporting, you risk facing big problems. Ultimately it is the carrier's responsibility for safely securing your freight, so make sure the carrier that you choose to transport your goods are qualified. Additionally, proper securement could come in handy, should a situation arise where you need to communicate how to secure your freight.

Here are some tips you can keep in mind:

- Make sure the driver inspects the equipment's securement points for any wear or damage.
- Before getting loaded, determine where the equipment should be placed on the trailers that will allow for optimal weight distribution and for proper securement.
- If loading equipment, ensure it is clean of any excess dirt, debris or other material before loading.
- Relay any instructions for securing equipment to the carrier/driver prior to picking up the shipment.
- Use direct tie-downs.
- Use chains versus other tie-down materials when possible.
- Have tie downs attached as close to possible to the front and rear of the equipment.
- Use chocks, cradles, and wedges when appropriate.

Basic accessories used to secure freight

STRAPS/TIEDOWNS

Straps or tiedowns are often used to safely secure loads during transit. All flatbed and unenclosed trailers should have straps on their trailers, however the number of straps on each trailer depends on the carrier or truck. It is very important to know the exact number of straps needed for each load.




CHAINS

Chains are used in the same way as straps or tiedowns to secure freight. Chains are typically used on heavier loads, like machinery, due to the weight of the freight. It is important to note that chains may scratch products in transit, so in some cases they may not be a suitable choice, or edge protectors may need to be utilized.




V-BOARDS/ EDGE PROTECTORS

V-boards or edge protectors are used to separate the load from the straps or chains to secure it. They help keep the freight safe and free from scratches from contact with the chains or straps. They also help keep the product from damaging the straps.




BLOCKING & BRACKING (DUNNAGE)

Blocking devices are used to keep freight on a trailer from shifting during transport. The device should be shaped to fit snugly against the cargo and should be braced properly to the floor of the trailer or between the load to create a safe separation of product. Dunnage is most commonly used for this.




COIL RACKS

There are many ways to ship coils, however most are shipped standing up or laying down. When shipping coils upright, they require properly placed dunnage and coil racks to prevent them from moving.



TARPS


One large portion of securing loads properly is tarping. Tarps are often made of heavy-duty vinyl coated polyester with D-rings and grommets so they can be secured over freight and to the trailer with ropes and bungee cords. Tarping helps protect the commodity from the elements, like rain, snow, wind, road debris, and helps prevent cargo theft. Over-dimensional loads often require more tarps than a typical truck carries, or even specific sized tarps for that commodity.



There are some different types of tarps you should know about:


LUMBER TARP

These are manufactured and used to protect lumber but can be used to protect other freight as well. Lumber tarps are generally 24' by 27' with a curtain window that will cover the front of the load.




STEEL TARP

Steel tarps are manufactured and used to protect steel loads. They don't take up as much volume, so there is less tarp material. Steel tarps are generally 16' by 24'.



SMOKE TARP

Smoke tarps are a smaller tarp that is made to be put over the front of the load to protect it from dust, smoke, or soot during travel. They are generally 10' by 12'.



Routing

Advanced planning is necessary when arranging your over-dimensional shipments. Depending on how your freight is oversized will determine what kind of restrictions you face during travel and how to determine your best route. You'll also need to know your routing in advance when applying for state permits and any needed escorts.

Overweight?

The Federal Highway Administration has maximum weight restrictions for any vehicles using the roadways.

The limits are:

- 80,000 lbs. of gross vehicle weight
- 20,000 lbs. of single axle weight
- 34,000 lbs. for tandem axle weight

You must keep in mind maximum weight allowances for bridges and roads within certain areas. Depending on your gross weight, you may have to find routing that goes around the areas your shipment cannot travel.

Too tall?

When a shipment is oversized by height, you have to look out for bridges, overpass, and other structure clearance. There may be times when traffic needs to be diverted from an area or power lines will need to be disconnected. This can take combined effort from cities, their police, and utility companies, which is why planning your routing well in advanced can help when it comes time to move.

Too wide?

Transporting extremely wide loads can require specialty permits. Depending on the width, road closures may be needed or only moved during certain times. Law enforcement escorts could be needed. Any load that is over 16' wide is deemed a super load and requires police vehicle escorts.



Meeting State Regulations

Every state has its own regulations when it comes to over-dimensional vehicles/loads traveling on its roads. It can be difficult to remember what every state requires and time-consuming to constantly search for the guidelines you need to know. We've simplified your search by having the most important information laid out in this guide, listed alphabetically by state.

Alaska

- Legal dimensions
 - Length: 75'
 - Width: 8' 6"
 - Height: 15'
 - Weight:
 - Single axle – 20,000 lbs.
 - Tandem axle – 38,000 lbs.
 - Tridem axle – 42,000 lbs.
 - Quad axle – 50,000 lbs.
- Permits
 - Oversize permits are valid for three days
- Escorts
 - One escort needed
 - Over 85' in length
 - Over 10' in rear overhang
 - Over 10' width
 - Two escorts needed
 - Over 100' in length
 - Over 35' in overhang
 - Over 12' in width
 - Three escorts needed
 - Over 14' in width
- Banner & safety regulations
 - Lights
 - Vehicles' beacon or light bar shall be amber in color and of a high intensity rotating, flashing, oscillating, or strobe style. The beacon must be roof mounted or mounted as close to the vehicles roof line as practical. The beacon should be visible for a minimum of 500' and through a full 360 degrees.
 - Flags
 - Flags must be square and a minimum of 16' on each side. Flags must be kept clean and clearly visible for duration of trip. They must be red or fluorescent orange.
 - Banner
 - Must read "OVERSIZE", "OVERSIZE LOAD", "WIDE LOAD", or "LONG LOAD". Signs must be kept clean and clearly visible for duration of trip. Signs may be manufactured and hand painted, as long as it is black lettering on a yellow background and outlined in black. Must be 48' long by 12' wide.
- Operating times and restrictions
 - Oversized loads may travel during daylight only (half hour before sunrise to half hour after sunset) Monday through Saturday.

Alaska (Cont.)

- Holiday restrictions
 - Oversized loads are prohibited from moving during holiday periods. If holiday falls on Sunday or Monday, then movement is restricted from 12:00 am from previous Friday through 12:00 am Monday. For holiday falling on Friday or Saturday, movement is restricted from 12:00 pm Thursday through 12:00 am Sunday.

 - 1,001-2,000 lbs.

 - Tridem axle – 42,000 lbs.
- Permits
 - Permits are valid for five consecutive days.
 - Limits
 - Length: 150'
 - Overhang: 20'
 - Width: 16' (over 16' cannot use Interstate)
 - Height: 16'
 - Weight
 - 5 axles – 102,000 lbs.
 - 6 axles – 124,000 lbs.
 - 7 axles – 146,000 lbs.
 - 8 axles – 168,000 lbs.
 - Loads exceeding these dimensions, or over 180,000 lbs., are considered Super Loads.

Alabama (Cont.)

- Escorts
 - One escort
 - Length is over 90'
 - Rear overhang exceeds 5'
 - Width exceeds 12'
 - Height exceeds 16'
 - Two escorts
 - Length is over 105'
- Banner & safety regulations
 - Banner
 - "OVERSIZE LOAD" signs in front and rear of any over width or overlength vehicle. They must be black letters on yellow background and 7' wide by 18" high. There are no sign requirements for over height or overweight only.
 - Lights
 - Must be equipped with flashing or strobe amber light, visible 360 degrees at 500'. If escort vehicles are required, they must be equipped with warning lights.
 - Flags
 - All oversize vehicles require 18" square fluorescent orange flags at front and rear corners.
- Operating times and restrictions
 - Daylight travel only. Half hour before sunrise to half hour after sunset, Monday through Saturday. No travel on Sundays.
- Holiday Restrictions
 - No travel on major holidays and holiday weekends.

 - 80,001 to 100,000 lbs.

 - Over these dimensions and 250,000 lbs. requires a "Class C" permit. A route survey may be required.
- Escorts
 - One or more escorts

 - Over 14' in width
 - Over 16' in height
- Banner & safety regulations
 - Banner
 - All over width loads exceeding 9' in width shall display "OVERSIZE LOADS" signs.
 - Signs must be 6' long with 1' high letters in black with yellow background.
 - Flags
 - All oversize vehicles must display 18" square fluorescent orange or red flags at four corners of the load.
 - Lights
 - During nighttime operations, red warning lights at the four corners of the loads are required.
 - Any front or rear overhang must be flagged or lighted up.
 - No sign or flag requirements for over height or overweight only loads.
- Operating time & restrictions
 - Travel only during daylight hours. Half hour before sunrise to half hour after sunset.
 - Loads not over 14' wide, 16' high, 12' long, and 250,000 lbs. may travel on Interstate and specified state routes from 3:00 am to 12:00 pm on weekends.
 - No over-dimensional loads allowed on I-17, I-10, or SR 60 within city limits of greater Phoenix area, or I-10 or I-19 within city limits of greater Tucson area between hours of 7:00 am to 9:00 am and 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm on weekdays.
- Holiday restrictions
 - No travel on major holidays

Arkansas (Cont.)

- Operating times and restrictions
 - Movement is during daylight hours only, seven days a week.
 - No oversized movement through the Greater Little Rock area from 7:00 am to 9:00 am or 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm on I-30, I-40, and I-630.
- Holidays
 - No travel on major holidays. If a holiday falls on a Monday or Friday, no weekend movement is allowed.

 - Over 15' wide, 17' high, or 135' long are considered super loads.

- Banner & safety regulations
 - Banners
 - "OVERSIZED LOAD" signs are required in front and rear for all oversized loads. Signs that state the exact nature of the shipment; "WIDE LOAD", "LONG LOAD" "EXCESSIVE FRONT OVERHANG", "EXCESSIVE REAR OVERHANG" may also be used.
 - If shipment is over 100' the "LONG LOAD" sign should be displayed. Lesser loads in length should use "OVERSIZE LOAD".
 - Signs must have 10" high letters in black with a yellow background.

California (Cont.)

- Flags
 - Flags are required at all four corners of the load, and at the end of the load if projections are greater than 4'.
- Lights
 - For night running, amber marker lights are required at front corners of load and on left outside extreme edge, visible from front and sides. Red lights are required at rear corners visible from rear and sides.
 - Los Angeles county also requires amber lights at all protrusions and at 5' intervals completely around the load (and red in rear).
 - When a rear overhang is 4' or greater, two lights or a rear light bar are required at night.
 - Rear light bar is not needed on long load in daylight unless turn signal and brake lights are hidden by load.
- Operating times and restrictions
 - Able to move 24 hours, 7 days a week.
 - No travel from 6:00 am to 9:00 am in and around Los Angeles, San Diego, Sacramento, and San Francisco.
- Holiday restrictions
 - No travel on major holidays, and Washington's Birthday.

- Weight: 80,000 – 117,000 lbs. gross
 - Single axle – 20,000 lbs.
 - Tandem axle – 36,000 lbs.
 - Tridem axle – 42,000 lbs. (8'1" – 8'5" spacings), 36,000 lbs. (8' spacings), 42,500 lbs. (greater than 8'6" spacings), 43,500 lbs. (greater than 10' spacings)
- Divisible loads exceeding 80,000 lbs. gross: You can exceed 80,000 lbs. gross without a permit on state highways and Interstate highways as long as you are legal on all axle/group weights and you are licensed for at least the amount of your gross weight.
- Permits
 - Valid for one day or one trip.
 - Must be obtained from Ports of Entry by driver.
 - Driver must call ahead at least one hour prior to arrival.
 - Failure to do so will result in up to \$500 fine and 24-hour shutdown.
 - Limits
 - Length: 110'
 - Width: 18'
 - Height: 17'
 - Weight:
 - Single axle – 25,000 lbs.
 - Tandem axle – 55,000 lbs.
 - Tridem axle – 65,000 lbs.
 - Loads in excess of these dimensions are considered Super Loads.
- Escorts
 - One escort
 - Over 25' rear overhang
 - Over 14' width on Interstate highways
 - Two escorts
 - Over 109' in length on two-lane highways
 - Over 13'11" in width or if load extends past center lane at any time
- Banner & safety regulations
 - Banner
 - All oversize load requires an "OVERSIZE LOAD" sign on the front and rear.
 - Signs must be 5' long, 10" high, with black lettering 8" high on a yellow background.
 - Flags
 - All over width vehicle/loads must have red or fluorescent orange 12" square flags mounted at the four corners of the load, on any extremity wider than the front/rear width of the vehicle, and at any rear overhang 4' or more.
 - If the overhang is less than 2' wide, than only one flag is needed, otherwise two flags are needed.
 - Lights
 - All over width loads require amber clearance lights on each front corner and red lights on the rear of the load, as well as on each extremity or projection.
 - An amber rotating, flashing, or strobe light is required on the vehicle.

Wyoming (Cont.).

- Over length loads require a red lamp and reflector on each rear corner of extremity of any rear overhang.
- Operating times and restrictions
 - Daylight travel, one half hour before sunrise through one half hour after sunset, including weekends.
 - Loads not exceeding 10' wide and all other dimensions are legal, may travel at night on Interstate highways with proper lighting.
- Holidays
 - Holiday travel is usually allowed for loads not requiring escorts.
 - However, Ports of Entry are not open on holidays, so check with Port on pre-ordering a permit for holiday runs.
- Fines
 - 1 – 2,000 lbs.
 - \$65
 - 2,001 – 4,000 lbs.
 - \$115
 - 4,001 – 6,000 lbs.
 - \$165
 - 6,001 – 8,000 lbs.
 - \$190
 - 8,001 – 10,000 lbs.
 - \$240
 - 10,001 – 12,000 lbs.
 - \$340
 - 12,001 – 14,000 lbs.
 - \$440
 - 14,001 – 16,000 lbs.
 - \$540
 - 16,001 – 18,000 lbs.
 - \$640
 - 18,001 – 20,000 lbs.
 - \$740
 - 20,001 lbs. +
 - \$1040

Conclusion

As you can see, it takes a lot to arrange an oversize/over-dimensional/Heavy Haul shipment. Depending on the state regulations, responsibilities lie to the drivers, carriers, and shippers alike.

The most important things are to:

- 1) Do your research;
- 2) Plan well in advance;
- 3) Keep effective and open communication amongst all logistics partners;
- 4) Remember safety is a top priority with these shipments;
- 5) Most importantly, keep this guide handy! You never know when you could use it.
