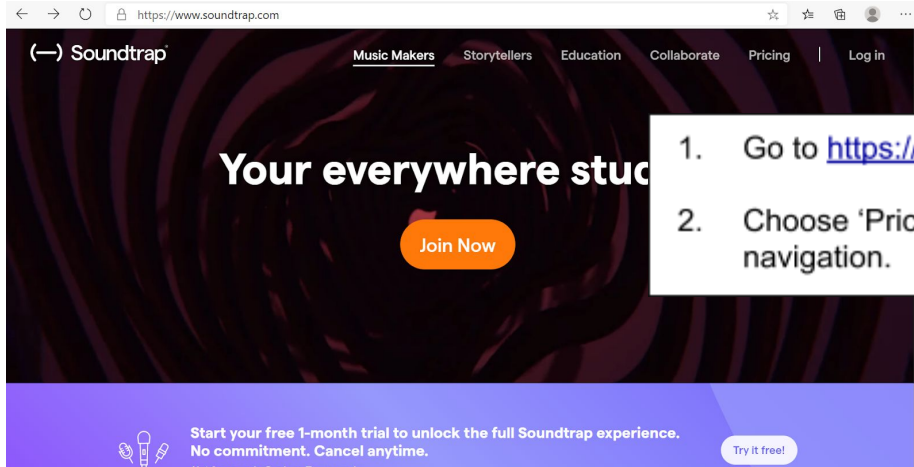
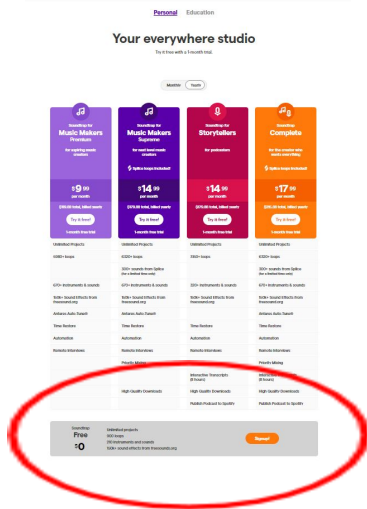


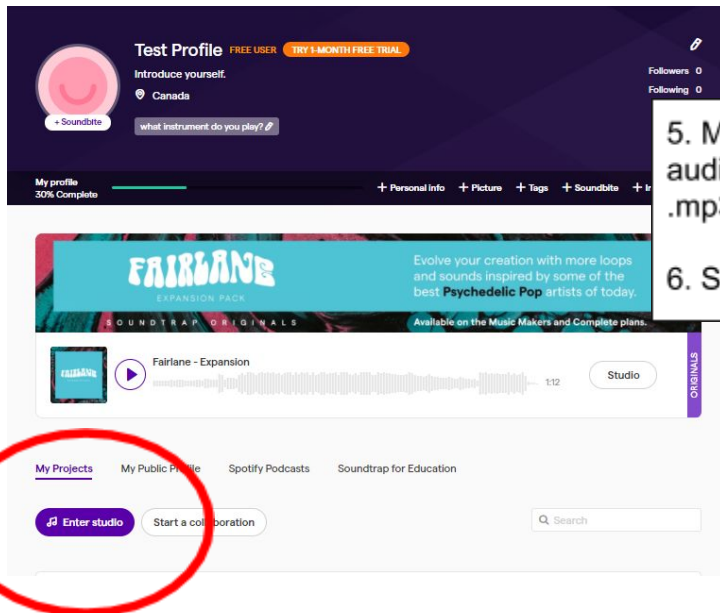
Soundtrap User Guide



1. Go to <https://soundtrap.com>
2. Choose 'Pricing' from the top navigation.




3. Scroll down to the bottom and choose the free plan.
4. Enter your email and a password to create an account.



5. Make sure you have all of your audio files saved to your computer as .mp3s
6. Select 'Enter Studio'.



8. Add and name your tracks. Drag and drop to reposition, and drag from either end of clip to crop audio.
