## **INTRODUCTION**

It would seem very incomplete to have a series on relationships and not have a real conversation about physical intimacy, and more specifically sex. Our culture reflects a very different idea of sex than the ideas that God has about it. What does God think about sex and why is it the first commandment given to Adam and Eve? Why is it that sex is so crucial to our marriages, but has the potential to be so confusing and even devastating outside of marriage?
