Overall summary	Face to face consultation and engagement with Aboriginal Organisations and agencies in East Gippsland and the Far East has been ongoing considering minor disruptions with COVID 19 / lockdowns	
GLaWAC	Cultural heritage and Values surveys undertaken and continue to be undertaken to determine impact and condition of key totemic species and Cultural assets. These surveys may include best practice excavations, surveys, research and mapping, Employment and training opportunities for Traditional Owners, focus is to have Traditional Owners working On Country and supporting Community healing. Establishing robust processes and systems to embed into GLaWAC that will support emergency and other focus areas into the future Employment: GLaWAC have created 5 new part time jobs for Gunaikurnai people, these positions work on Country and with JM Rangers, NRM and RAP crews to undertake Cultural and biodiversity assessments within and around the fire foot print. This work has been very successful, has included significant training and experience for GLaWAC crews and has developed and practiced survey methods that combine Cultural and scientific perspectives.  Buchan JMP work: GLaWAC JM Managers and crews have been heavily connected to almost all aspects of park regeneration works planning and delivery. This work commenced soon after the fire and the park was declared safe and is currently focusing on park strategic planning including future interpretation tools Research and Survey: Numerous research priorities were explored post fire, with GLaWAC's MOU with Monash Uni proving to be critical. Several sites have been excavated with work continuing. Finds have included Megafauna, numerous artifacts and the only physical evidence of Bogong Moth processing in Australia. GLaWAC's Bush Fire Recovery crew are contributing to research across the fire foot print through various means, one highlight was the recent recording of Poteroos within the fire foot print - in an area that has been surveyed several times by DELWP staff. One of the animals photoghaphed had a joey in its pouch.
