Dear Parents and Carers,

We cannot believe that we are approaching the end of the second week of the first term already! The week has certainly flown by and the children are very happy in their new classrooms. The children have all received their homework books (pink), which have all their details to access Seesaw, Mathletics, Bug Club and Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS). Homework books should be kept at home and all completed homework should be uploaded (photo) onto Seesaw by the following Tuesday. Homework uploaded after this day may not be marked. If you have any problems accessing any of the above or any questions, please do send your class teacher a message on Seesaw. Seesaw is a great communication tool between teachers and parents and we will often post announcements, so please do check it regularly.

In English this week, we continued to look at the features of recounts and the children have been writing about a great day that they had during the summer holidays. In Numeracy this week we have been looking at place value. Place value is the value of each digit in a number. It means understanding that 582 is made up of 500, 80 and 2, rather than 5, 8 and 2. In our You, Me and We topic, we explored the school rules and have been learning about the importance of presenting our work neatly and to a Year 4 standard. The children made self-portraits (selfies) and they wrote their goals for the year ahead. The children have learnt about how to stay safe online and will be soon starting our topic on 'coding'. In Science, we have had a lot of fun learning about solids, liquids and gases and took the opportunity to take our learning outdoors and act like the atoms (ask your child I am sure they will be happy to explain further).

In Year 4, the homework will consist of Topic and English one week, followed by Science and Maths the next week (it will always be linked to the learning we have been doing in class). Times tables, spellings and reading will be a requirement each week. The children will have a weekly spelling (Tuesday morning) and times table test (4JJ/4TK Monday afternoon and 4SI Wednesday afternoon) so please help your child by practicing these at home.


#### Science Task


