3. What do you think the “mighty weapons” are? Why are they needed and what are these weapons to be used for?
4. What are some of the obstacles that keep people from knowing the truth? How have you been able to overcome the obstacles you have faced?

Read [Psalm 139:1-4 and 23-24](#)

5. What do these verses say about God? About people?
6. Why do you think David asks God to “search me” if God already knows everything about him? What do you think David is trying to accomplish and how does this apply to people today?

- What do they say about people?
- How will I apply this to my life?

**Look Ahead:**

What lie do you need to replace with God’s truth? What will you do this week to make that lie obedient to Christ?
