Going: Eternal Perspective (Blake)

Look Back:

Who did you identify as the “one” in your life who still has doubts or questions about Jesus? What ways have you begun to purposefully engage them in your daily/weekly life?

Look Up:

Read [Matthew 6:19-21](#)

1. Who is Jesus talking to in this passage (reference [Matt. 5:1](#) for context) and what are the implications for today?
2. What do you think Jesus means by “Treasure” in this passage? How would you personally identify your treasure?
3. How much of your resources (time, energy/effort, money, focus) do you dedicate towards your treasures?

Read [Ephesians 2:11-13](#)

1. How does Paul describe what it means to be “lost”? Do you remember when YOU were lost?
2. How can truly understanding the shoes that the lost are in drive you to a heart change for your one?

Read [2 Corinthians 5:10](#)

1. Knowing Paul is speaking to the Christian (see [2 Corinthians 1:1-2](#)) - what do you think he is referring to in Ch.5 vs. 10?
2. What about your living today will last for eternity?
3. In what ways can you demonstrate a heavenly (eternal) mindset with your one?

Overall (Discovery Bible Study)

- What do these scriptures say about God?
- What do they say about people?
- How will I apply this to my life?

Look Ahead:

Mark out 5 min on your calendar everyday this week and begin praying for you AND your one. For you - pray God would break your heart for your one, to love them as Christ loves them with a pure motive. For your one - pray God would work in their lives and draw them to Him.

Notes:

What are you pursuing in life? Does your life pursuit match the eternal things that God calls us to? Outside of basic physical needs, we all long for deeper things such as purpose, identity, fulfillment, belonging, community, etc. The world and culture around us tries to satisfy these things with worldly possessions, personal status, and achievements however - these are all fleeting and will rust away. As disciples of Christ, God invites us into something much bigger than ourselves, He invites us into His work, something eternal, and along the way our identity and purpose are fulfilled as a bi-product of a life IN submission to Him.
