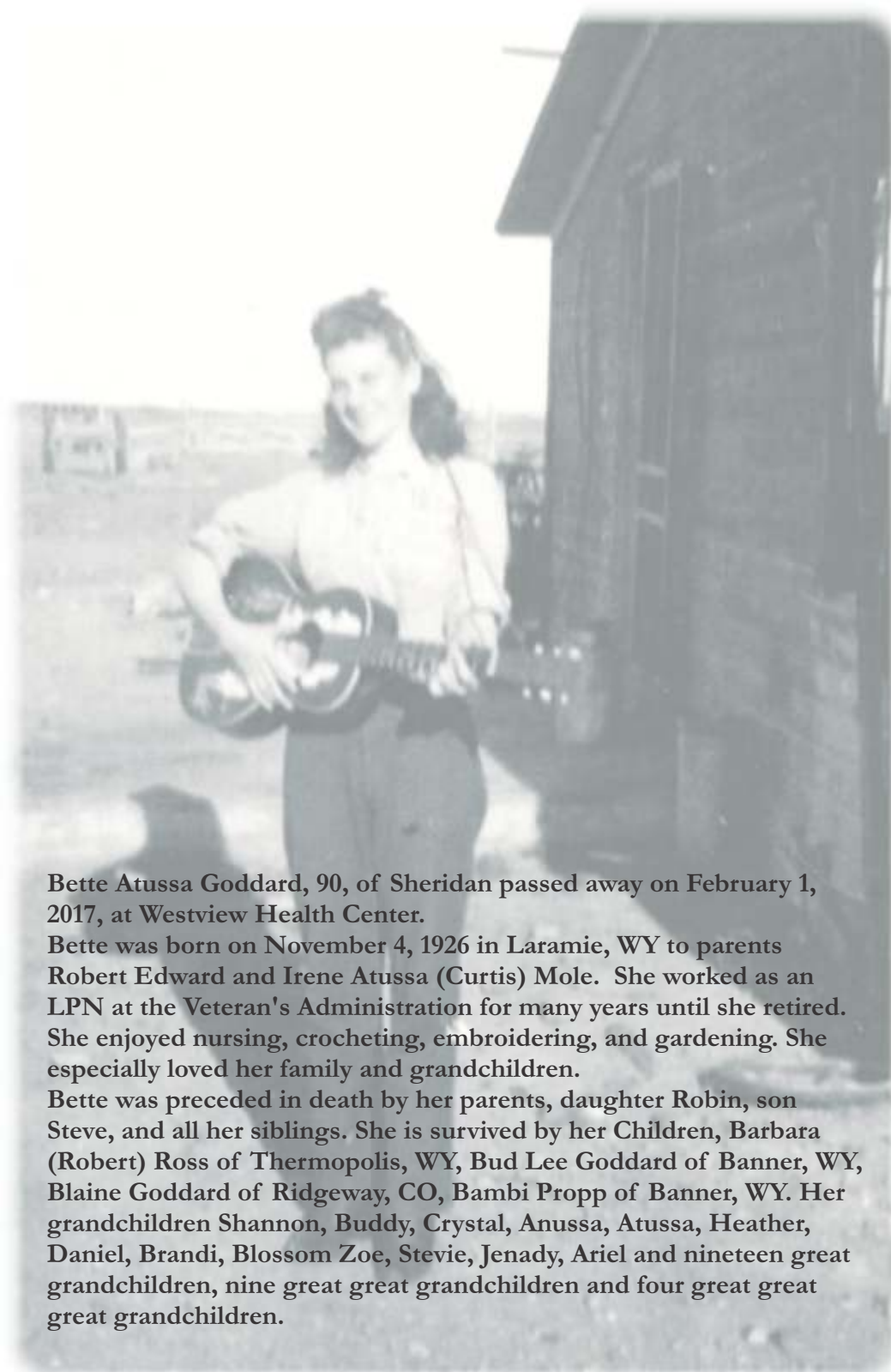


In Loving Memory Of Bette Goddard
