Marilynn & Dean always lived on National Wildlife Refuges. In 1974 they moved to Squaw Creek National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) at Mound City, MO. Next was DeSoto NWR at Missouri Valley, IA in 1976. In 1983 they moved to Malheur NWR at Burns, OR. In 1985 they moved to Upper Souris NWR at Foxholm, ND. She taught or substitute taught during those moves. She loved living on rural wildlife refuges and bringing up two wonderful daughters away from the hustle and bustle of city living.

Marilynn received a B. A. in Art from Minot State University. She liked to work mainly in watercolors, screen printing, and colored pencil. Marilyn and Dean moved to Buffalo in 2006.

Marilynn was an active member of St Luke's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Buffalo. She enjoyed studying the bible and enriching her knowledge and faith. She was a member of the Buffalo Quilting Gals and loved to attend the Loose Threads group.

Marilynn was preceded in death by her parents and stepmother LaVeda Mae (Blacksmith) Wieneke.
