He was a Life Member of the VFW Post 1560 and a member of the Elks Lodge 520.

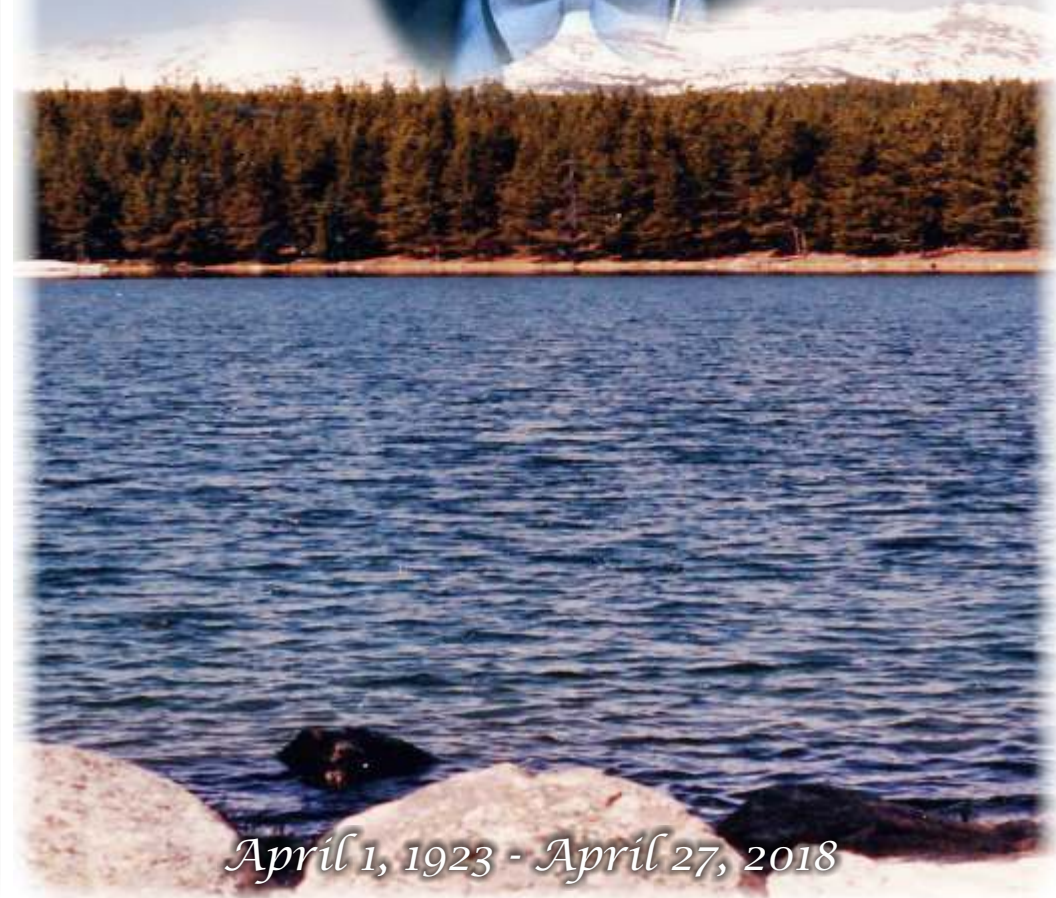
