<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Device to join on Zoom• 1 paper, cardboard, or canvas at least 8x10"• Colored pencils and/or markers• Acrylic or tempera paint: Blue, brown, white, black + other desired colors• 6-egg compostable egg carton• Paintbrush(es)• Scissors• Liquid glue• Scrap paper• Colorful construction paper• 3 paper plates• Popsicle stick, straw, or unwanted pencil or pen• Yarn or string (alternative: thin strips of paper)• 1 cardboard or poster board between 8x10" and 18x24"• Toothpicks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Some of these projects will benefit from a variety of other crafting materials, such as: construction paper, small shells or rocks, glitter, pom poms, coffee filters, pipe cleaners, tissue paper, empty paper rolls, and anything else that your child might like to use! Whatever you are able to access will work great for your child's project!• Be sure to protect your child's work surface if they are using paint!

Day 4	Twilight and Dark Zones	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> 2 paper plates<input type="checkbox"/> Scissors<input type="checkbox"/> Popsicle stick, straw, or old pencil or pen<input type="checkbox"/> Acrylic or tempera paint: blue and other desired colors<input type="checkbox"/> Paintbrush(es)<input type="checkbox"/> Water cup<input type="checkbox"/> Liquid glue<input type="checkbox"/> Yarn or string (alternative: thin strips of paper)<input type="checkbox"/> Masking tape<input type="checkbox"/> Stapler	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> This project could get messy! Lay down a tablecloth or similar protective material and provide your child with paper towels or rags.<input type="checkbox"/> We need to cut out the middle of one of the plates. You can do this for your child as prep if you like: Just cut out the flat part of the plate (and keep the scrap!)<input type="checkbox"/> Gather supplies
Day 5	Abyss and Trenches	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Cardboard or poster board between 8x10" and 18x24"<input type="checkbox"/> Scissors<input type="checkbox"/> Acrylic or tempera paint: Any desired colors<input type="checkbox"/> Paintbrush(es)<input type="checkbox"/> Water cup<input type="checkbox"/> Colorful construction paper<input type="checkbox"/> Liquid glue and/or glue stick<input type="checkbox"/> Toothpicks (not crucial but very fun!)<input type="checkbox"/> Optional: Masking tape	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> This project could get messy! Lay down a tablecloth or similar protective material and provide your child with paper towels or rags.<input type="checkbox"/> Your child will want to cut their cardboard or poster board, so if cutting cardboard sounds challenging, opt for poster board instead!<input type="checkbox"/> If your child is using paint, be sure to protect their work surface!<input type="checkbox"/> Gather supplies
