As at **9 July 2014** the Police and Crime Commissioner has approved the following grants for 2014/15. The grants are funded by Community Safety Funding with £0.77m being made available. Funding was provided on the condition that projects helped to deliver against the PCCs policing priorities and all were considered to be a means of securing crime and disorder reductions which would be measured by final outcomes.

2014/15 grants were subject terms and conditions contained with a <u>Grant Agreement</u> sent to all successful applicants. Payment of grants will be made in two stages, on receipt of the signed agreement and following the submission of a mid-year monitoring form by 1 October 2014.
