Title: Funding to HALO for a service to support victims of honour based violence, forced marriage and female genital mutilation (£14,400)

Executive Summary

HALO have been providing the only service in County Durham and Darlington that supports victims of honour based violence (HBV), forced marriages (FM) and female genital mutilation (FGM). HALO is the only dedicated HBV/FM agency in the North East and is a member of the National FM Home Office Network, with access to national projects working on these issues, learning from which they would share with Durham Constabulary and the PCVC Office.

The number of reported incidents is small, in comparison to other crime types, but any case that occurs will be significant in terms of its impact on the victims and the communities involved and the agencies that must respond to the consequences. Cases of HBV/FM/FGM are complex and victims often remain with HALO to receive ongoing counselling and support for periods of up to and exceeding two years. It could be longer for those victims who are engaged with the Criminal Justice System and are experiencing protracted court cases.

Support can include daily and weekly contact with victims at crisis point and, at a minimum, ongoing liaison either by phone or face to face meetings. The HALO support service is operated during office hours Monday to Friday, however, an on-call advice and emergency support (free-phone) service is available 24/7. From crisis or referral HALO provides specialist, culturally appropriate advice and support to victims that will help them move on from untenable situations of violence to lead independent lives free from harm.

We would like to grant fund HALO to be a referral pathway for the community, police and partners for the year ending 31st March 2018.

Decision: To grant fund HALO to provide a service that supports victims of honour based violence, forced marriages and female genital mutilation in County Durham and Darlington at a cost of £14,400.
