A. Words List Learning Test

The examiner will read a list of 15 unrelated words aloud to the client. The client will then be asked to recall as many of the words as possible, in any order, immediately after each presentation of the list. The process will be repeated three times. After a delay of 10-15 minutes, the client will be asked to recall as many words as possible from the list.

B. Story Recall Test

The examiner will read a short story to the client and ask the client to recall as many details as possible immediately after hearing the story. After a delay of 10-15 minutes, the client will be asked to recall as many details as possible from the story.

"Hi, I'm Penny," Penny says. "Are we related?"

"Oh, thank goodness," Penny says and then blushes. Penny always blushes when she is nervous, embarrassed, or hot; right now, she is all three.

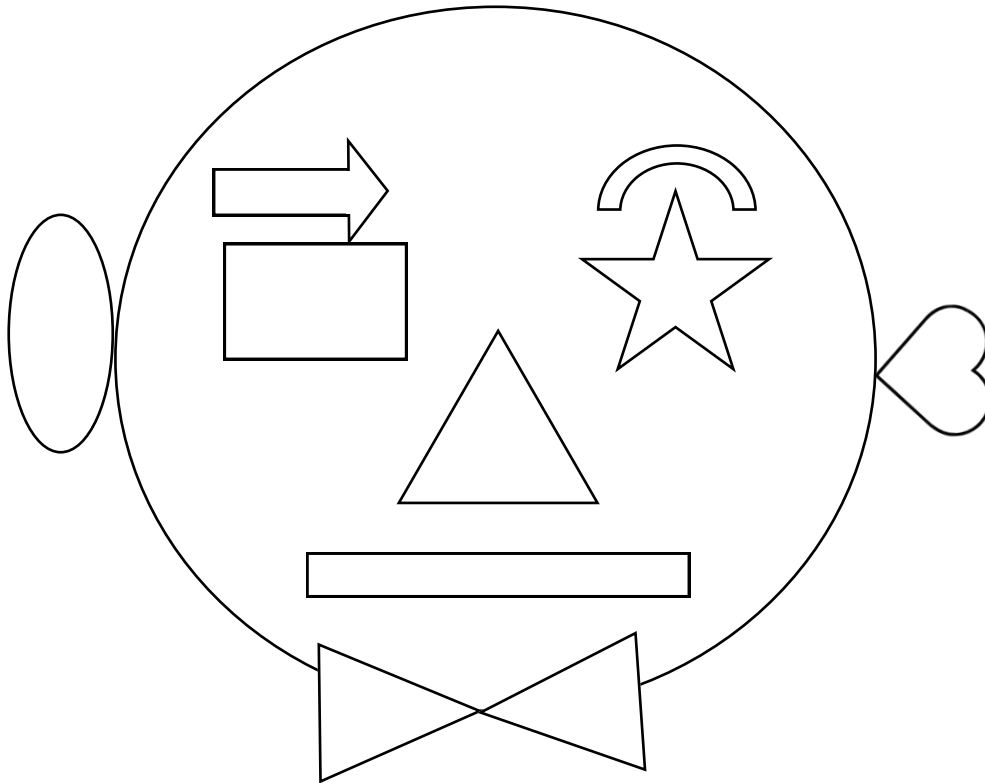
Handsome Paul laughs and asks, "Would you like to get a hamburger with me? They smell delicious." Penny smiles, "Sure. I love hamburgers!"

C. Spatial Memory Test

The client will be shown a simple geometric design for 10 seconds and then asked to draw the design from memory.



D. Digit Span Test

The examiner will read a sequence of numbers aloud to the client and ask the client to repeat the sequence back to the examiner. The length of the sequence will start with two digits and increase by one digit with each subsequent sequence. The process will be repeated in reverse order, starting with a sequence of two digits and increasing by one digit with each subsequent sequence.

Scoring System and Interpretation

A. Word List Learning Test

Score:

Immediate Recall: Score 1 point for each correctly recalled word after each presentation of the list (maximum score of 15).

Learning: Score 1 point for each new word recalled after each presentation of the list (maximum score of 15).

Delayed Recall: Score 1 point for each correctly recalled word after the delay (maximum score of 15).

Score	Interpretation
0 - 4	Severe impairment
5 - 9	Moderate impairment
10 - 14	Mild impairment
15	Normal performance

B. Story Recall Test

Score:

Immediate Recall: Score 1 point for each correct element of the story recalled (maximum score of 5).

Delayed Recall: Score 1 point for each correct element of the story recalled after the delay (maximum score of 5).

Score	Interpretation
0 - 2	Severe impairment
3 - 4	Mild to moderate impairment
5	Normal impairment

C. Spatial Memory Test

Score:

Score 1 point for each correctly drawn element of the design (maximum score of 10).

Score	Interpretation
0 - 3	Severe impairment
4 - 7	Mild to moderate impairment
8 - 10	Normal performance

D. Digit Span Test

Score:

Score 1 point for each correct sequence of digits repeated back to you (maximum score of 8 for forward digit span, maximum score of 8 for backward digit span).

Score	Interpretation
0 - 2	Severe impairment
3 - 5	Mild to moderate impairment
6 - 8	Normal performance
