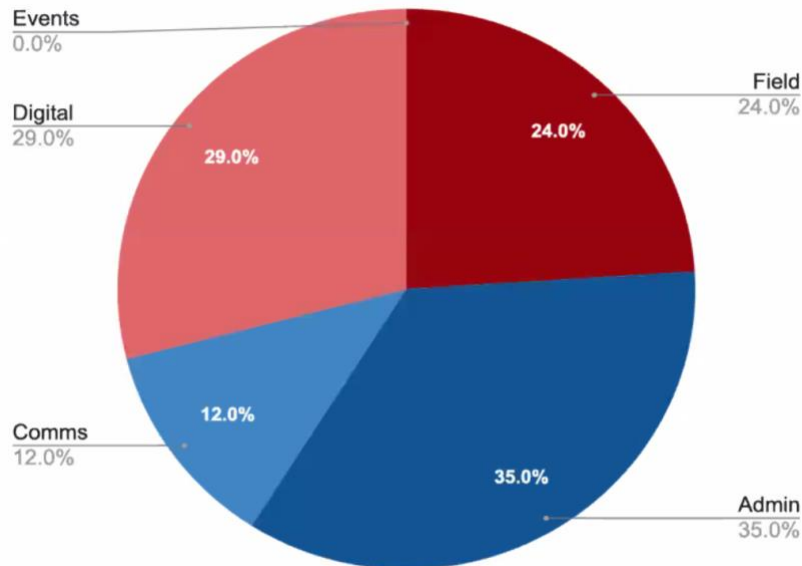

- 10. Chair's Report**
 - 10.1. Everyone rallied together to work to move digitally, overcome an office fire, and persevere through a pandemic.
 - 10.2. We elected Joe Biden & Mark Kelly but lost critical seats at the County level. We know with the new Board elected today; we will continue to make great strides in the years ahead.
 - 10.3. MCDP PC member growth: 1,1512 in 2020, the highest we have ever seen! We are recruiting active PCs in their LDs, which shows the momentum of Democrats at the grassroots level. We connected with hundreds of new voters.
 - 10.4. Fundraising: \$1,075,700 raised in 2020! We outraised the Arizona Republican Party. We raised more money than any county party in the United States. 3,733 new donors in 2020, 4,621 total donors in 2020.

11.1. Sole mission of MCDP is to elect County Candidates.

11.2. 2019 Strategy: Building → Bank Accounts, Electorate, Bench of qualified candidates, volunteer base, relationships

11.3. 2020 Priorities: Turnout low efficacy & new democrats, engage communities of color in districts that are historically ignored, promote local candidates.

11.4. Maricopa County is 64% of Arizona's vote!

11.5. Maricopa County is larger than many STATES in our country!

11.6. MCDP did all the work they were able to do with the resources available, for a plethora of candidates, while the State Party and Senate Candidate had \$115m to promote just one candidate.

- 11.8.1. Field team quickly came on board to set teams up to phone bank virtually, calling from anywhere.
- 11.8.2. We need more volunteers, precinct committeepersons to cover all ground to support our candidates. Lessons learned for 2022!
- 11.8.3. MCDP made history!
- 11.8.4. 5.2 million views of all advertisements!
- 11.8.5. 496,018 video advertisement views
- 11.8.6. 71, 870 unique click links to our voter guide and locations.maricopa.vote
- 11.8.7. Digital Plan
 - 11.8.7.1. June 1 to November 3. Saw the highest number of visits in October after ballots mailed.
 - 11.8.7.2. Digital voter guide: how to vote, how to register, where to drop off ballot, track ballot by text. Included Spanish.
- 11.8.8. Paid advertising with 2020 partners included local radio stations (bilingual ads and videos).
- 11.8.9. Election Results & Recap – swing voters won't vote passed top of the ticket or won't vote for Democrats down ballot.
 - 11.8.9.1. Example of undervotes in MCDP, darker blue indicates higher undervotes, meaning they voted for Joe Biden and Mark Kelly, but did not vote down ballot.
 - 11.8.9.2. Spending resources on voters that will never vote down ballot is incredibly disappointing.
 - 11.8.9.3. We cannot rely on independents and republican voters to vote for democrats.
 - 11.8.9.4. Where we work to increase engagement in women and voters of color, we win.
