Sale Town Centre Heritage Precinct Permit Exemptions

1.0 Application

This incorporated plan applies to the Sale town centre precinct and places that are individually listed on the Heritage Overlay schedule within that precinct as shown on the attached Sale Town Centre Heritage Precinct Incorporated plan map.

2.0 Definitions

A *significant* place is a place of local significance to Wellington Shire and has an individual citation in the *Wellington Shire Heritage Place Citations 2007* incorporated document. These places are shown as *significant* on the precinct maps attached to this report and some are individually listed in the Schedule to the Heritage Overlay.

A *contributory* place is a place that contributes to the significance of a heritage precinct. They are shown as *contributory* on the precinct maps attached to this report, and some have an individual citation in the *Wellington Shire Heritage Place Citations 2007* incorporated document.

Any place that is not shown on a precinct map as being *significant* or *contributory* is *non-contributory* and therefore does not contribute to the significance of the heritage precinct.

3.0 Statement of Significance

The following statement of significance for the Sale Town Centre precinct is from the *Wellington Shire Heritage Places Citations 2007* incorporated document. Please refer to that document for further information about the precinct including a history and description, as well as citations for places of individual local significance within the precinct.

The Sale Town Centre precinct is of local historic and aesthetic significance to Wellington Shire. Historically, the precinct illustrates the key development phases of Sale from the late nineteenth to the mid-twentieth century when it became the leading regional centre in Gippsland. It contains the earliest commercial centre in Foster Street, which demonstrates the importance of early transport links in the formation and positioning of activities within the town centre, with later development along Raymond Street illustrating the influence of the railway. Aesthetically, the precinct contains groups of nineteenth century buildings, which provide fine examples of commercial streetscapes of that era, notably in Foster Street and the southern end of Raymond Street. (RNE criteria A.4, D.2 & E.1)

4.0 Elements of particular significance

The attached precinct maps show the properties that are Significant or Contributory within the precinct. The following buildings, areas, structures and trees are of particular significance:

- Commercial buildings from the late nineteenth and early twentieth century
- Civic and community buildings and open space including the Presbyterian Church and the Login Reserve and trees
- Victoria Hall, Macalister Street
- The Cobb & Co. Stables (former), Raymond Street
- The Criterion Hotel, Macalister & York streets
- Mechanics' Institute, York Street
- The Sale Technical College, Macalister Street
- The former Sale Municipal Buildings, Macalister Street

5.0 No Planning Permit Required

Under Clause 43.01-2 of the Wellington Planning Scheme, no planning permit is required for the following development within the Sale Town Centre heritage precinct subject to the Heritage Overlay:

- Demolition of a non-contributory building shown on the precinct map.
- Signage situated below verandah at ground floor level on a Contributory building or non-contributory building as shown on the precinct plan.
- Above verandah signage on a non-contributory building unless the building is adjoining a Significant or Contributory building as shown on the precinct map.
- Installation of an automatic teller machine on a non-contributory building.
- Alteration to the front of a non-contributory building if at least 80 per cent of the building front at ground level is maintained as an entry or display window with clear gazing.
- An awning on a non-contributory building that projects over a public road reservation if the awning is authorised by the relevant public land manager.
- Install street furniture or undertake roadworks.
