As a province known for its hospitality, we're excited to welcome the 2023 Canada Winter Games to Prince Edward Island. From February 18 – March 5, 2023, the Games will bring together 3,600 athletes, managers, and coaches, across 20 different sports, for the largest multi-sport event in the country. With a forecasted economic impact of over \$100 million, the 29th edition of the Canada Games will be the largest event hosted in Prince Edward Island's history.

The Canada Games are a celebration of sport, culture, and youth that unites our country and strengthens communities. They represent the pinnacle of inter-provincial and territorial sport and are a springboard for Canada's next generation of national, international, Olympic, Paralympic, and Special Olympic champions.

MEET THE MASCOT - WOWKWIS

Meet Wowkwis, the 2023 Canada Winter Games mascot.

Wowkwis (Whoa-quis) was named after the Mi'kmaq word for "red fox," which celebrates the rich history of our province.

A local, who hails from world-famous North Rustico, Wowkwis' favorite colour is turquoise because it resembles the water in the bay, and her favorite sport is ringette. Wowkwis plays a vital role in welcoming the rest of Canada to PEI and showcasing the spirit, heart, and spark of the 2023 Canada Winter Games.

The mascot name and design were inspired by North Rustico student Myla Doucette, who was eight years old at the time. Her design showcases the local art and culture of the Abegweit Mi'kmaq First Nation people by uniquely integrating quillwork that Wowkwis wears, crafted by local Island artist Noella Moore.

Wowkwis' eyes are turquoise, resembling the water in Rustico Bay.

QUILL


Crafted by Island Artist, Noella Moore, the quill showcases the local art and culture of the Mi'kmaq First Nation people.



VOLUNTEER UNIFORM

All volunteers are provided with a 2023 Canada Winter Games uniform from Karbon, a proud partner of the Canada Games, to easily identify you as a part of the volunteer team. Volunteers are required to arrive for their shift in uniform, clean and presentable and clothed properly for the weather.

The 2023 Canada Winter Games volunteer uniform includes a winter jacket, mid-layer full-zip jacket, long sleeved shirt, and toque. Volunteers are asked to wear self-provided pants. Pants should be a solid color, free of tears and professional looking. If your role is outside, volunteers are asked to wear solid coloured snow pants and proper winter boots.

Remember:

- Uniforms should not be worn prior to your Games-time duties
- Keep your uniform clean and presentable at all times
- Your uniform pieces should be the outmost layer
- Write your name in each of your uniform pieces
- Do not alter or modify your uniform
- · Do not wear your uniform if you are on venue as a ticketed spectator


If you remain in your uniform after your shift, you are representing the 2023 Canada Winter Games. Please be mindful of your actions.



ACCREDITATION

All volunteers are provided with an accreditation badge that is required to access all 2023 Canada Winter Games venues. The accreditation badge grants access for your assigned role(s) at your venue(s) for specific zones. You may also have privileges to access other areas and/or services required for your role. You must have your accreditation badge with you at all times. If you forget your accreditation badge for a shift, you must report to the Volunteer Lounge at your venue to arrange for a day pass.

Wear your accreditation badge at all times while on shift.	Give your accreditation badge to anyone else.
Wear your accreditation badge forward facing and visible at all access control points at all venues.	Alter your accreditation badge.
Use your accreditation badge to access T3 Transit system for free.	Forget your accreditation badge at home.
Use your accreditation badge to access venues only during your scheduled shifts.	Attempt to access privileges and/or venues or zones that are not displayed on your accreditation badge.



VOLUNTEER LOUNGES

The Volunteers Services team will provide care and comfort for volunteers during their shifts at Games time. Most venues are equipped with a Volunteer Lounge where food and drinks are available to provide volunteers with a space to relax and refuel.

Volunteer Lounges do not provide a safe, secure, locked area for personal possessions. Volunteers should refrain from bringing valuables with them to their volunteer shifts.



BREAKS FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICES

All volunteers are given a 15-minute break during the first five hours of a shift and are provided with a light grazing snack. All volunteers whose shifts exceed six hours receive a half-hour break and additional food options.

Check with your supervisor at the beginning of your shift for your scheduled break time.

AFTER YOUR SHIFT IS DONE


- 1. Check out with your supervisor when your replacement arrives

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU CAN'T MAKE YOUR SHIFT

If your schedule changes and you cannot make an accepted volunteer shift, our Volunteer Services team needs to know so we can fill the shift.

TRANSPORTATION

PLANNER

Volunteers are responsible for their own transportation to and from their volunteer shifts throughout the Games. Due to some parking restrictions and limitations at venues, please use the T3 Transit system or carpool when possible. The T3 Transit system is free to all volunteers when in uniform and wearing accreditation.

You may be traveling early in the morning or late at night. Stay safe by walking in well-lit areas, coordinating transportation with another volunteer and telling someone when you are leaving and what time you should arrive.

GENERAL INFORMATIONAND POLICIES

Code of Conduct

Volunteers will be the face of the 2023 Canada Winter Games, so we are seeking individuals who are friendly, outgoing, knowledgeable, empathetic, and service-oriented. As integral members of the 2023 Games team, volunteers will be expected to conduct themselves in a professional manner, abide by the Volunteer Code of Conduct and uphold the core values of the Host Society.

Rights and Responsibilities

As a PEI 2023 Canada Winter Games volunteer, you can expect the following:

- to have a safe, supportive and healthy environment
- to be treated respectfully, fairly and equitably as part of the team
- to have access to information about the Canada Games, its history, policies and purpose
- to receive reasonable accommodation for any special needs they may have
- to know that their personal information will be kept confidential and used only for the purposes in the application process
- to receive a volunteer assignment that engages their skills, interests and experience
- to receive guidance and training for their specific role
- to receive ongoing guidance, feedback, encouragement and recognition from the Host Society Board, staff and planning leadership volunteers

In return, we ask that you, as a volunteer:

- Approach your volunteer role with enthusiasm, honesty and an open mind
- Maintain a positive and enthusiastic attitude
- Treat others with respect, courtesy, fairness and empathy
- Exercise sound judgment in decision-making and maintain confidentiality

- Ask questions to ensure that you understand a role/task before accepting it
- Carry out your role efficiently, effectively and to the best of your abilities, asking for help when needed
- Represent the Games in a professional manner at all times
- Participate in the training offered by the 2023 Canada Winter Games Host Society to familiarize yourself with the Games and with your duties
- Ensure your physical and emotional safety and that of your fellow 2023 Canada Winter Games volunteers, participants and guests, while carrying out your assigned duties
- Not use obscenities, derogatory or discriminatory language or tell inappropriate jokes
- Not express any negative comments or perspectives about the Games while on duty, in uniform or while volunteering
- Follow all policies and standards, and comply with all relevant provincial and federal laws
- Not be under the influence of, or affected by, illegal drugs, controlled substances or alcohol during volunteer shifts
- Promptly report any potential, perceived or actual wrongdoings and violations of the Code of Conduct
- Provide positive or constructive feedback to their direct report(s) as applicable
- Adhere to the conditions of the Volunteer Commitment, Consent and Waiver Form

A detailed list of policies, procedures and the complete Code of Conduct are available at **2023canadagames.ca/get-involved**. Access to venues and accreditation may be removed for anyone who fails to meet security screening or comply with the spirit of the Code of Conduct, policies and procedures.

Conflict Resolution Policy

The Host Society is committed to creating a safe, supportive and healthy work environment; reporting and addressing conflict is an important aspect of creating this environment. If you have an issue that should be brought to our attention the following process should be followed:

- Volunteers should first attempt to reach a resolution satisfactory to all parties at the original level of involvement.
- Failing this, talk with a Supervisor and they will determine to whom they will escalate this matter, i.e., either the Venue Lead or the Functional Area Lead, and they will brief them on the nature of the conflict.
- The Supervisor will advise you on next steps.
- If the Venue Lead or Functional Area Lead, as the case may be, is unable to resolve the conflict to your satisfaction, document your concerns in writing and submit them to the Director of Volunteer Services, Cara Squires (csquires@2023canadagames.ca).

- The Director of Volunteers Services will, in turn, discuss the conflict in confidence with the Host Society Safe Sport Officer (sso@2023canadagames.ca) and determine whether a complaint should be resolved through the Host Society's Human Resources Policy, or whether it constitutes Maltreatment pursuant to the UCCMS Safe Sport Policy and must be referred to the Independent Third Party ("ITP") (itp@2023canadagames.ca).
- You must initiate your complaint in writing to the Director of Volunteer Services within seven (7) days of the issue arising.
- You will receive a reply to your report within 2 (two) days of submission.

INDEPENDENT THIRD PARTY

- Volunteers are defined as Participants under the 2023 Canada Games Host Society's UCCMS Safe Sport Policy. Where appropriate, complaints initiated by or about Volunteers may be administered through UCCMS Safe Sport framework via the ITP.
- The ITP, Lise MacLean, is independent from the Boards and Management of the Host Society, and is responsible for implementing the Host Society's UCCMS Safe Sport Policy. The ITP may take any reasonable action provided for under this policy, the UCCMS Safe Sport Policy, and the Anti-Racism & Anti-Discrimination Policy.
- The decision of ITP can be referred to the Ombudsman committee for review.

OMBUDSPERSON COMMITTEE

- The Ombudsperson Committee is made up of three individuals, independent of the Host Society and staff, as appointed by members of the HR and Compensation Committee of the Board of Directors in advance of the 2023 Canada Games.
- The Ombudsperson Committee's role is to consider applications to review a decision of the ITP or Host Society Personnel.
- You must submit your request for action from Ombudsperson Committee in writing in one of the following ways:

Regardless of the position you hold, you are interacting with others - other volunteers, members of the public, athletes, coaches, referees and media. If an issue arises, you may be approached to deal with it as a volunteer. Issues may be out of your control and you may not be equipped with the answers. Try offering one of the following alternatives.

Service Excellence

As a 2023 Canada Winter Games volunteer, you play a key role in representing our Host Society and are at the forefront of ensuring athletes, visitors, other volunteers and, most importantly, you have a memorable experience during this once-in-a-lifetime event.

AVOID	DO SAY
I don't know	Let me find out for you
No	What I can do for you is
You're right, this is bad	I understand your frustrations
That's not my fault	Let's see what we can do about this
I'm busy right now	I'll be with you in just a moment
Call me back	I will call you back, what is the best number to reach you at?

WORDS WITH DIGNITY

The words we use are powerful. Here is a guide to using respectful language.

Remember: Person first, not the disability.

Ask & Listen – ask if you can help and then listen and respect what they say. Speak directly to the person with the disability, not their companion, assistant or sign language interpreter.

USE
Person with diabetes, arthritis, etc.
Person with a disability
Person with a mental illness, person with a mental health issue
Person who is hard of hearing, person who is deaf

USE

Person who is deaf-blind

Person with Down's Syndrome, person with an intellectual disability, person with a developmental disability

Person who is visually impaired

Person who stutters, person with a communication disability

Person with a mobility disability, person with a spinal cord injury

Person who uses a wheelchair

Accessible parking, accessible washrooms

Persons without a disability

When interacting with people in wheelchairs: don't hang or lean on a wheelchair. Always ask and wait for consent before touching a wheelchair. Place yourself at eye level with the person when possible.

When interacting with visually impaired people: identify yourself and anyone else who is with you when speaking.

When interacting with people who are hard of hearing or deaf, get in their line of sight and wave your hand to get their attention.

When interacting with people who have verbal communication challenges, be patient and wait for the person to finish their thoughts.

The volunteer team is made up of individuals from a variety of backgrounds and experiences. In order to maintain a positive environment for all volunteers, it is imperative that all pronouns, identities, and cultures are respected.

Clean As You Go

This policy applies to all volunteers. The Clean As You Go Policy is designed to maintain and ensure the cleanliness and hygiene of a workplace are at the highest standard.

This includes:

- Obstructions in walkways (remove garbage bags, cardboard boxes, other debris, etc.)
- Keep all areas clean and tidy
- Pick up and dispose of any garbage or recycling you find
- · Empty waste bins regularly
- Take lost and found items to information kiosks
- Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds

Social Media Policy

Employees, volunteers and participants shall not post negative or disparaging content, either real or perceived, about the Canada Games Council, the Canada Games, the Government of Canada, professional or amateur sport industries/organizations, individual athletes, colleagues, customers, consultants, suppliers, sponsors or business partners.

Volunteers shall refer all media inquiries for information or requests for interviews to the media volunteers. Media volunteers liaise directly with staff regarding media inquiries. Volunteers should not act as spokespeople for the Games.

Volunteers must use their best judgment when using their personal social media to interact with athletes, parents/guardians of athletes, coaches, and other individuals affiliated with the Host Society.

- Only positive posts that are respectful of others and support the PEI 2023 Games.
- 2. Think about how everyone would view a post or image. What you may find humourous may be offensive to someone else.
- 3. Ensure duties are being fulfilled first and foremost. It is inappropriate to be on your device while duties or people are being ignored.

STAYING SAFE AND WARM

Safety First

The safety, health and well-being of everyone connected to the Games is our top priority. Safety requirements exist for everyone's protection and should be followed at all times. If you should see a problem in your work area, report it immediately to your supervisor.

Report All Incidents

Report all incidents, issues, concerns, and near-hits (misses) to your supervisor as soon as you become aware of them. This includes physical safety concerns as well as harmful behaviour and communications.

If you can resolve the issue safely on your own (moving a box from an emergency exit), please do so.

If the incident or issue is serious, requires urgent attention, contact your supervisor immediately.

Record all details on an Incident Report and submit it to your supervisor. Incident Reports can be found in the Venue Operation Centre.

Hazards

Venue teams make every effort to ensure venues are safe for everyone, however occasional hazards may occur. These hazards are reviewed in venue orientation.

Refuse Unsafe Work

You have the right to refuse to perform a task if you believe there is a risk of harm or potential for accident. If you have health or safety concerns, contact your supervisor immediately.

Staying Healthy

COVID-19 and Other Illnesses

Do not come to your shift if you are not feeling well. Contact your supervisor as soon as possible to advise that you are unable to come to your shift and to confirm next steps.

Hydration

Use a reusable water bottle and find out where to fill it.

Food

Healthy energy-fueling snacks will be available at every venue. For those working longer, 6+ hour shifts, meals will be provided.

Working in the Cold

Many of the 2023 Canada Winter Games volunteer roles are outside. Volunteers in these roles must make sure they are prepared to spend their shift outside, if the weather is extreme.

Your PEI 2023 Games volunteer uniform includes a Karbon winter jacket and toque. Be sure to wear these and bring additional layers, if needed.

How to Stay Warm

- Cover exposed skin
- Work in sunny areas when possible
- · Take breaks inside
- Wear quality, insulated clothing
- Keep footwear dry
- Keep moving to generate body heat but stop before you sweat;
 if your inner clothing layer gets wet, you'll lose heat

If you are working outside, the 2023 Canada Winter Games ensures:

- There is an on-site heater or heated shelter to warm up in
- Your schedule allows for breaks to warm up
- There is always someone else around, so you don't work alone in the cold
