## Elementary


As a young boy, St. Patrick was sold into slavery in Ireland. During that difficult time he developed a deep prayer life and eventually escaped and grew to be the Bishop of Ireland! Patrick was responsible for teaching many people about Jesus and as a result many converted and became Christians. Patrick used the green shamrock to explain the three Persons in one God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Creative Activity: Take a sponge and cut out the shape of a heart. Using green paint stamp it three times to make the shape of a shamrock, each time saying "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Then dip your finger in the green paint to make the stem.

## Middle School

- The feast of St. Joseph is celebrated in some areas of the US and widely in Italy with parades, special Masses, and carrying blessed fava beans. Another tradition is setting up a **St. Joseph altar** displaying custom Italian dishes like huge pans of pasta, fish, and bread to enjoy and also give to the poor. As a family, make a special St. Joseph's day dinner, or altar, with enough extras to donate to a local shelter or family in need.

Amen.


