### **Executive Summary**

California is home to almost one-third of the United States' AAPI population and some of the most established Asian American communities in the nation. In Alameda county, AAPIs comprise over 32% of the population, the largest ethnic group in both Alameda and its neighboring Santa Clara county. Over 300,500 residents of Alameda county speak an AAPI language at home

San Francisco and Oakland's Chinatowns date back to the 1850s. Although a hub of economic activity and culture, Chinatowns were also born out of discrimination and limited economic opportunities available to Asian Americans. That legacy lives on with nearly a third of Oakland's Chinatown residents living below the poverty line.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, anti-AAPI hate crimes rose dramatically, with almost 40% of all incidents occurring in California as of June 2021. The majority of hate incidents occured in the Bay Area: 292 in San Francisco, 58 in San Jose, and 55 in Oakland as of February 2021.

In response to the rise in anti-AAPI incidents, there have been a number of public safety, legal, and community-based interventions addressing anti-Asian hate and providing support to impacted communities. These continue the Bay Area's long history as a center for social justice movements.

Promoting AAPI visibility and belonging

#### **Governor Newsom Signs API Equity Budget**

The \$156.5 million API Equity Budget is sponsored by the API Legislative Caucus. The majority of funding will go to victim services, with additional funding to track hate incidents, data equity, restorative justice in schools, and ethnic media outlets.

### Good Good Eatz (previously Chinatown Improvement)

Connecting ethnic food districts across Oakland.
