Integrated Course application process

Course Content and Structure

Module 1
Basic Flight Training



Basic flight training stage comprising ground and flight training to private pilot licence level. First solo and navigation flying is achieved, and nine foundational academic subject areas are studied.

Module 2
ATPL TK Phase 1



Intensive period of classroom and self-directed study of academic subjects at the Airline Transport Pilots Licence level.

Module 3
CPL Flight Training



Consolidation of pilot-in-command skills, solo navigation practice, and flight skills to Commercial Pilot standard. Introduction to instrument flight

Module 4
ATPL TK Phase 2



Intensive period of classroom and self-directed study of academic subjects at the Airline Transport Pilots Licence level.

Module 5
ME IR



Advanced flight training in aircraft and simulator to achieve multi-engine and instrument flight qualifications.

Module 6
APS MCC



Introduction to airline crew operating environment, including jet familiarisation and multi-crew skills.

- ✓ **Have the right to live and study in the EU – fluent in the English language, level 6.5 IELTS or higher**
- ✓ **The Leaving Certificate or equivalent, with passes in 5 subjects including Maths, English & preferably a Science subject**
- ✓ **Obtain a Class 1 medical**
