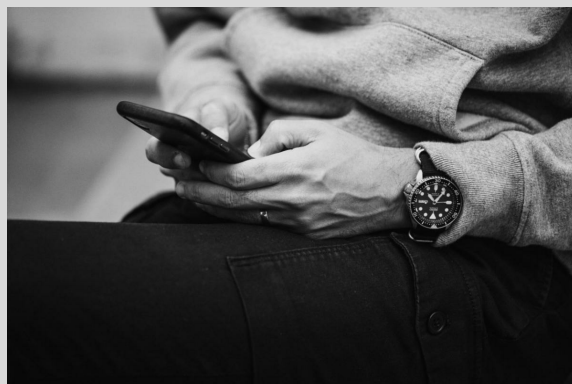
April marks National Child Abuse Prevention Month as well as National Volunteer Month and I wrote this op-ed that recently ran in the newly-established Lawrence Times. You can read it [HERE](#).

A few recent highlights:

Your support has given our volunteers working with teens the chance to continue to be invaluable supports for their kids; responding to phone calls, texts, and emails from both the teens & their foster parents.

One volunteer took quick action when her CASA teen began talking to her and her foster parent about running and making other concerning statements. This volunteer contacted her Coordinator on staff at CASA, and they worked together to make sure the foster parent and case managers were all on the same page and informed about the teen's mental state at that time. The CASA volunteer expedited the communication process and her teen was able to get some of her questions and concerns addressed in a more timely manner than if the volunteer had not been involved. This volunteer's positive relationship with her teen and knowledge of her case were crucial in this situation.

We were relieved to hear that another volunteer recently helped her teen locate a community resource to assist in obtaining a restraining order against a bully. Yet another volunteer's teen spoke up in court to thank everyone involved in her case, and specifically thanked her CASA volunteer, saying "I love you so much; you're the greatest!" This volunteer had recently driven several hours for a surprise visit with the teen in her new placement. The appreciative hug she received is just one of the reasons that this volunteer enjoys working with teenagers.



Now that most of our volunteers are fully vaccinated, many are feeling more confident taking their kids on outings. One volunteer recently spent 5 hours with her 10-year-old CASA child. The two went to the Topeka zoo and spent time at Gage park, where he loved climbing on all of the equipment and riding the miniature train. They talked about animals and she was

impressed by how he took turns with others who were out on that beautiful spring day.

Your support is making all of these visits and relationship building possible. The trust that exists between CASA volunteers and kids they serve is one of the most important protective factors in child development as these kids strive for more stable lives. Thank you for helping safeguard that trust.
