**WWII VETERANS TO COMMEMORATE
73rd ANNIVERSARY OF V-J Day AT WORLD WAR II MEMORIAL**
*Wreaths will be laid at Memorial's Freedom Wall in remembrance of the more than
400,000 Americans and 60 million people killed worldwide during WWII*

Washington, D.C. – On Sunday, September 2nd at 11:00 a.m., the Friends of the National World War II Memorial (Friends) and the National Park Service will host a ceremony and wreath presentation at the World War II Memorial's Freedom Wall to commemorate the 73rd anniversary of the Allied Forces Victory in the Pacific and the end of World War II.

The ceremony will celebrate the spirit of unity of the American people during this pivotal moment in our nation's history and give recognition to all World War II veterans, especially those who fought in the Pacific Theater during the war, as well as all those who served on the home front.

As part of the commemoration, nearly a dozen WWII veterans will place wreaths at the WWII Memorial's Freedom Wall in remembrance of the more than 400,000 Americans and 60 million people killed worldwide during the deadliest military conflict in human history. Friends will pay special tribute to each of the WWII veterans in attendance.

ABC7/WJLA-TV news anchor, Jonathan Elias, will serve as the event's Master of Ceremonies. A U.S. Navy Band Brass Quintet will perform throughout the ceremony.
