It is a critical resource and meeting place where Indigenous communities, conservation organizations, educators, government leaders, and researchers from around the world come together and tackle our greatest conservation challenges. With investments in programming, infrastructure, and operations from Wild Champions like you, Noloholo will become the premier conservation innovation and learning hub for Tanzanians and practitioners from across the continent. HUMAN-WILDLIFE COEXISTENCE

Develop Win-Win Solutions that Save Keystone Species and Support Indigenous Ways of Life APW reduces human-wildlife conflict through innovative solutions that balance science and technology with traditional knowledge. Through your support, our efforts save keystone species like lions and other large carnivores who might otherwise be killed as their habitats collide with expanding human communities. The program includes education and construction of Living Walls—environmentally-friendly corrals—preventing livestock attacks by large carnivores with a 99% success rate. Indigenous-led Warriors for Wildlife teams prevent human-wildlife conflict across five programmatic areas. They guide communities in the installation of Living Walls, collect real-time data about conflict events, and help locate lost livestock at pasture. Our growing Sustainable Rangelands Initiative preserves vital habitats that support human prosperity, thriving wildlife habitats, and greater climate change resilience.

Equality Matters:
Support Female
Leaders in Changing
their Communities
and the World

Women play a critical role in rural and Indigenous communities throughout the world as stewards of traditional knowledge about their natural environments and the management of precious natural resources. But too often, Indigenous women in rural communities are excluded from conservation programming, decision-making, and leadership.

You can help APW disrupt that dynamic by investing in female leaders in conservation. Working intimately with rural women to co-create and co-implement conservation programming, APW brings women to the table from the beginning. Our sought-after women's leadership development program merges female empowerment and environmental programming to break down barriers that have held women back from conservation leadership positions. Your support will allow APW to expand our Women's Conservation Enterprise programming for 200 women's groups in Tanzania; create a nationally-recognized "Women in Conservation" internship program and introduce ten new Girls Clubs programs; and increase the percentage of women in leadership roles in conservation and development at APW and in Tanzania.
