### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. What do you think it would have been like to be at this very strange and magnificent Passover dinner with Jesus and the disciples? How would it have felt to sit with the Jesus depicted in this passage of Scripture?
- 2. Judas went to the chief priests and asked, "What will you give me if I deliver Him over to you?" He was looking for something "better" than Jesus. Is there any thing, dream, or relationship in your life that you think will bring you more hope, more something, than Jesus?
- 3. Consider the circumstances when you know you turn from God because He will not give you something you want or because He does not seem to satisfy. Are there any triggers or patterns you can identify?
- 4. What can others around you (your community group, friends, or family) ask or pray for you to help you begin to break those patterns?
- 5. "The big idea of this text isn't the rebellion of Judas but the remarkable mercy of Jesus." How can you take what you learned from this Scripture and sermon and "be confounded afresh by the beauty of the Redeemer"?





6. Was taking communion during service any different after hearing this message? Did anything new strike your heart as you contemplated Jesus' sacrifice, ate the bread, and drank the cup?
