MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

As members, we join together for God's glory and our mutual benefit. Membership is a commitment between the Congregation's members, one with another and between the Congregation's leaders and members.

IF YOU WANT TO BE A MEMBER, YOU MUST:

- 1. Have a personal relationship w/Jesus Christ (born again) Acts 2:41a.
- 2. Be baptized in water following salvation Acts 2:41b.
- 3. Attend the one-time class Bethel Life.
- 4. Attend the one-time class Servant Life.
- 5. Attend at least 8 of the 12 Deeper Life classes.
- 6. Finish the "Firm Foundations" workbook (available in the bookstore) **or** transfer your church membership from your previous church. If your previous church membership grounded you in the major teachings of the Bible, you may ask them to transfer your membership to Bethel by sending us a letter on church letterhead (c/o Dann Farrelly) or emailing membership@ibethel.org
- 7. Be actively involved in a ministry and/or pursing it when membership requirements are finished.
- 8. Sign a "Membership Commitment" as a token of the commitment in our hearts (which the board will then approve).
- 9. Submit a complete "Membership Application" with picture of yourself (if one was not taken in the Deeper Life class). You can also send a picture by email to membership@ibethel.org.

ABOUT THIS MEMBER PACKET

- The next page contains the section in our bylaws explaining membership. It is for you to keep.
- Carefully read and pray about the membership commitment. If you believe God wants you to make this commitment, fill it out along with the application, front and back. Submit them both with a current picture of yourself (a picture with your spouse is OK too).
- Upon approval of the membership commitment by the COE (Council of Elders) we will give you a signed copy for your records. When you receive it do not return it to us!
- The application asks if you are in agreement with our Statement of Faith and Statement of Purpose from our bylaws. We have included them in this packet so you can read them prior to submitting your application. Please also keep them for your records.

BYLAWS: MEMBERSHIP SECTION

ARTICLE THREE – MEMBERSHIP COMMITMENT

Section 3.01. <u>Membership</u>. The Congregation will have members. Membership is an outward formalized sign of the commitment in an individual's heart. As members, we join together for God's glory and our mutual benefit. Membership is a commitment between the Congregation's members, one with another and between the Congregation's leaders and members.

Section 3.02. <u>Membership Rosters</u>. The COE and the individuals it delegates will maintain a roster of both active members and inactive members. The COE will periodically review the Congregation's membership rosters and place individuals on either the active members or inactive members roster as appropriate. The COE may remove individuals from either roster pursuant to Section 3.07.

Section 3.03. <u>Membership Standards</u>. We invite those who meet the membership standards and regularly attend services to become active members of the Congregation. Each active member must affirm the following membership standards in writing that will be included on the membership commitment form promulgated by the COE:

- 1. I have been saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ and boast in Him, not myself (Eph. 2:4-10).
- 2. I have been baptized in water at some point in my life, signifying conversion and new life in God (Matt. 28:19; Col. 2:12).
- 3. I take responsibility as a disciple of Jesus to continue to enjoy my own close, obedient, loving friendship with the Lord. (John 15:1-17).
- 4. My life evidences a genuine experience of regeneration the new birth. (John 1:12-13, 3:3-8; I Peter 1:18-25) and a commitment to holiness, wholeness and our church family (Romans 6:4, 8:1-4, 13:13-14; Eph. 4:17-32, 5:1-2,15; I John 1:6-7). Specifically, I affirm the sacredness of sexuality and marriage. In marriage, I will be completely faithful to my spouse (Heb. 13:4). I believe Scripture teaches that sex is a blessing to be rightly experienced only within heterosexual marriage. Therefore, I will avoid sex outside of marriage, pornography, living as husband and wife when not married and/or homosexuality (Matt. 15:19, Rom. 13:13, I Cor. 6:9-20). As well, I will follow the wisdom of the Lord by refraining from intoxication with alcohol and/or drugs (Rom. 13:13, Gal. 5:19-21). Should I stumble in any of these areas, I will get up again with the help of the Holy Spirit and my church family.
- 5. I have read and am in agreement with Bethel's Statement of Faith and Statement of Purpose found in Sections 1.01 and 1.02.
- 6. I contribute regularly to the support of the congregation in the form of tithes, offerings, time and attendance.
- 7. I agree to be governed by the congregation's bylaws as they pertain to church life.
- 8. If offended, I would not abandon this commitment but would speak the truth in love (Eph. 4:25) and work through conflict with gentleness, grace and forgiveness (Eph. 4:1-3).
- 9. I will be thankful (Col. 3:15) and live humbly and honorably in all my relationships with both Christians (Eph. 4:1-6) and non-Christians, so as to be a faithful ambassador of Christ's kingdom (II Cor. 5:20).
- 10. I will be accountable to keep these commitments and welcome correction in my life and doctrine if need be.
- 11. If the Lord seems to be transitioning me to a different church, I will not simply leave but consider this transition with my church family. Bethel will transfer membership to other congregations when requested to do so.

Section 3.04. Membership Application and Procedure. Persons eligible for membership who wish to become members of the Congregation must make their desire known to the COE by application and signed membership commitment form. The COE will examine the applicant in accordance with membership standards in Section 3.03 above. The COE has the right and authority to determine the eligibility and acceptability of all membership applicants by majority vote. For each individual the COE approves for membership, the Secretary will record their name in the COE meeting minutes, will add the newly accepted member's name to the active member roster, and will send the newly accepted member a letter of acceptance. New members may be publicly received as members at any Sunday service.

Section 3.05. Inactive Members. Any active member may be declared an inactive member by the COE's majority vote who:

- A. Absences themselves from the Congregation's services for a period of three consecutive months or more;
- B. Ceases to contribute to the Congregation's support for a period of three consecutive months;
- C. Are under charges for misconduct;
- D. Have unrepentantly given themselves over to sinful or worldly practices; or
- E. Departs from the membership standards

A member who the COE has declared to be an inactive member will have no voting privileges until the COE restores them to fellowship as an active member and reinstates their name on the active member roster. Any of the above listed causes are sufficient grounds to terminate a person from membership (Matt. 18:15-18; Romans 16:17-18; I Cor. 5:11; Gal. 1:8-9; Titus 3:1-15).

Section 3.06. <u>Voting Constituency</u>. All active members 16 years of age or older, in good standing, constitute the Congregation's voting constituency. Each member of the voting constituency may cast one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members.

Section 3.07. <u>Termination of Membership</u>. Active members wishing to end their relationship with the Congregation may do so by notifying the COE, Senior Elder, or the Congregation's Secretary in writing. Active members desiring to be transferred to another church may apply to the Congregation's Secretary for a letter signed by the Senior Elder, Secretary or other COE member, which will be granted on the Senior Elder or COE's approval. The COE is empowered to periodically remove from the membership rosters those who are deceased, or who may have voluntarily withdrawn from the Congregation's fellowship, or who have been granted letters of transfer, or have remained in inactive membership status for a period decided upon by the COE or who have not responded to discipline and have been asked to permanently leave fellowship with the Congregation.

Section 3.08. Membership of the Senior Elder and Ministerial Staff. By virtue of office the Senior Elder and his spouse will be active members during the Senior Elder's tenure. By virtue of appointment each ministerial staff member and their respective spouses will be active members during the staff member's tenure or period of employment.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

WE BELIEVE...
