

Year 10 visit to the Bank of England and Parliament

On Tuesday 18th June our Year 10 Economists visited the Bank of England and the Houses of Parliament. At the Bank of England students learned how the Bank attempts (not always successfully) to control inflation using interest rates. They also learned that there are 3.6bn bank notes in circulation and the methods that that Bank uses in order to prevent counterfeit notes being produced, such as using the new plastic notes, water-marks and foil strips. They also discovered that a bar of gold weighs 12.4kg and is worth £420,000.



Afterwards our economists took part in a workshop where they learned the importance of campaigning, creating their own campaigns for gender equality of wages, LGBTQ+ rights and women's suffrage.


Mini beasts thrill Year 8!

FINANCE UPDATE

- ♦ Lettings: The Charter School has a wide range of high quality sports facilities, drama and assembly spaces and outdoor areas available to hire outside of normal school hours. We hire our facilities to the local community and external organisations for birthdays, sports clubs, conferences, charity events and much more. - ParentPay accounts: There have been lots of exciting trips and activities taking place over the Summer Term. Please ensure that any outstanding payments for these are paid via your ParentPay account by the end of July. Due to budget cuts and restraints it is essential that payments are made on time and we request that all parents/carers and staff consider this so that money that would be used on educating our students is not having to be used to cover unpaid fees for trips, music lessons and other extra-curricular activities. - ♦ Music Tuition: If you would like to request music tuition for your child please contact Ms. Tidball. If you would like to cancel your child's music tuition next term we require 5 weeks' notice BEFORE the start of term as noted in your music provision contract outlining the terms and conditions by all parties. All requests must be made by email: ktidball@charternorthdulwich.org.uk
- ♦ School Fund: We have raised just over £15K from voluntary parental contributions in this this academic year. Since we launched the scheme we have received just over £42k which has been spent on a brand new mini bus and has contributed to the cost of the new water fountains and bottle refill stations around the school. Thank you to everyone who has contributed as this generous support of the school helps us to deliver resources and projects that the school budget would not normally be able to cover. Parents/carers can make voluntary contributions to the school via their ParentPay accounts.

Firefly for Students

The school VLE (Virtual Learning Environment) is called Firefly and can now be accessed by students using an app on their phone which can be downloaded for free.

Firefly for students allows pupils to view their timetables and manage their tasks on their phone:

- Tasks—check and respond to homework that teachers have set or create their own 'to-do' lists
- Messages—review messages sent by teachers
- Planner—access their timetable
- * Dashboard—an overview of upcoming lessons and tasks due

Pupil Premium:

Is your child eligible for free school meals? If you are on a low income, or on benefits, then you may be able to claim free school meals for your child. An automatic £2.20 credit will be applied to your child's biometric account every lunch time enabling your child to purchase a meal deal of that value.

School also receives additional funding from the Government for every child who gets free school meals to help support their education. The pupil premium means that even if you don't wish to access a free daily meal, applying will mean that this school will receive additional funding that can help support disadvantaged students in school. You would also be entitled to a 30% discount on all trips, events and activities.

The Charter Schools Educational Trust reflect the importance of cultural and arts opportunities in supporting the wider learning of Pupil Premium students. We have removed barriers to help our students within the extended curriculum to learn a new creative skill by introducing an annual fee of £50 for music tuition. Students are offered the opportunity to have 30 minutes paired tuition per week. UNIFORM

Uniform – which should be worn to and from school every day and to Achievement Evenings

- * The school navy blue *V-neck* sweater with the Charter logo which must be worn (unless directed otherwise)
- * A white polo shirt with our logo
- * No long sleeve tops are to be worn under the polo shirt.
- * Navy blue or black formal trousers worn around the waist no chinos or jeans
- * A formal navy blue or black skirt worn at a length that is appropriate for school no tight-fitting skirts
- * Plain black hard leather shoes are to be worn. No canvas or suede shoes, boots, trainers, 'Converse' of any description, or any other soft trainer-style footwear are to be worn. Plain black hard leather Kicker shoes are acceptable
- * Tracksuit tops and hooded tops are not allowed in school
- Plain navy blue, black or white knee or ankle height socks, or plain black or navy blue tights. No leggings
- * Plain black coat only no logos, no denim or leather jackets
- * No jewellery allowed except one small pair of ear studs that must be worn in the lobe of the ear. No other piercings are allowed
- * Make up may not be worn in Years 7–11
- * No false eye-lashes or nail extensions are to be worn.
- * Hair must be of a natural colour
- * No tattoos of any description
- * No Headwear allowed except plain navy blue or black head bands may be worn. Head scarves (including 'do-rags') are not to be worn except for religious or medical reasons
- * Any neck scarves worn must be plain navy or black.

PE Kit – which needs to be brought to each practical lesson, even if a student is unwell or injured

- * Plain navy blue or black sport shorts or skirt and/or leggings for girls
- * Navy or black jogging/tracksuit bottoms
- * Light blue Charter PE T-shirt
- * Navy Charter PE Sweatshirt
- * Non-marking trainers
- * Football boots for lessons on the field
- * Plain navy or white socks

Equipment - Ready to Learn

Every student must bring a school bag big enough to carry A4 folders and books every day. The following basic items need to be in the bag:

Pencil case containing:

- * Two black or blue biros
- Pair of compasses
- * Green biro
- * Ruler 30 cm and protractor
- * Pencil and eraser
- * Calculator
- * Coloured pencils
- * Pencil sharpener

The school bag should also contain:

- * The Planner
- * Exercise book
- * Reading book
- * PE kit if needed that day
- Other practical equipment needed

Friends update and thank you



A huge thank you to all the parents who have helped the Friends raise our biggest total ever this year and everyone who has taken part in any of our meetings, events or fundraising campaigns.

Over the last few months we have:

- Supported Y7 parents organise the first Year 7 disco with over 130 students taking part.
- We joined up with TCSED for the first time to participate in a joint fun run in Peckham Rye. We hope this will become an annual tradition. Well done to the parents, teachers and students who braved the rain.
- Parent helpers have staffed bars and refreshment stalls at the amazing Grease production and sports day. Second hand uniform sales have also started aimed particularly at the new Y7 parents and students starting in September.
- Our Plastic-free Charter campaign has helped fund the fantastic new water filling stations around the school. Working with the school council we hope to support a supply of reusable water bottles but so far the new refill stations have saved almost 24,000 300ml bottles!
- The Friends have also agreed funds to support a range of visits, equipment and school improvements this term. For example, a theatre visit, gardening club, yoga mats, bean bags for learning support rooms, and contributions to the Y8 football and watersports trips.
- A task force of parents and carers took up their spades and brushes to replant beds, weed, sweep and paint areas of the school to help tidy and green the outside space. The Friends have funded new plants and we hope to continue with more task force activities in the Autumn.
- After the incredible success of the Secret Charter parent team, we are delighted that cameras and lights for Art, instruments for music and staging accessories for drama this term. We can't wait for the grand opening of the new art room space in October.
- For the scientists amongst you, our successful Wolfson Foundation bid means that one of the school science labs will become a new model high-spec classroom for September.
- We continue to work with school on the redevelopment plans and funding for the reading garden. We hope to see work starting on this during late 2019/early 2020.
- Finally we arranged our annual 'thank the teachers and staff of TCSND' justgiving campaign so all the staff can enjoy a well deserved end of year party. Thank to all who donated and sent messages of thanks which will be shared with all the staff at the school.
