



Cookie Policy for STOOFF

At STOOFF, we use cookies to enhance your browsing experience and to understand how our website is being used. This cookie policy explains what cookies are, how we use them, and how you can manage your cookie preferences.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or mobile device by websites that you visit. They are widely used to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site.

How do we use cookies?

STOOFF uses cookies for two main purposes:

1. To enable the use of certain features on our website, such as the intro loader.
2. To collect anonymous information about how our website is being used, through the use of Google Analytics. This information helps us to understand and analyze trends, to improve the functionality and user experience of our website, and to tailor our marketing efforts.

What types of cookies do we use?

There are two main types of cookies: session cookies and persistent cookies. Session cookies are temporary cookies that are deleted when you close your browser. They allow websites to link the actions of a user during a browser session. Persistent cookies remain on your device for a set period of time specified in the cookie. They are activated each time you visit the website that created that particular cookie.

STOOFF uses both session and persistent cookies.

How can you manage your cookie preferences?

Most web browsers allow you to manage your cookie preferences. You can set your browser to block or alert you about cookies, or to delete cookies that have already been set.
