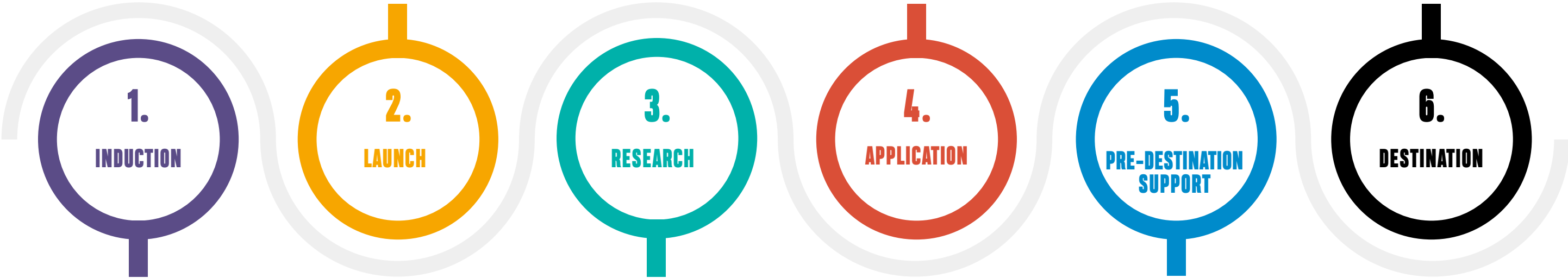
Careers is launched throughout the college with a host of Careers events.

EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS



As part of your induction you will be introduced to a common set of attributes, skills and knowledge.

All students should aim to develop these skills. As such, the college strives to embed these throughout every programme of study.

The development of these skills helps you to:

- Find new ways of thinking and problem solving
- Recognise the impact of your actions and teach you to take responsibility for what you do rather than blame others
- Build confidence in getting along with and working well with other people
- Be reliable and dependable: doing what you say you will by the deadline you have agreed and turning up when you are meant to be there
- A willingness to learn new skills, whether those are job-specific or more general

In addition to this, we will help you build a package of useful documents including a CV, cover letter and application questions. We will give you the opportunity to practice interview techniques in preparation for both work and voluntary opportunities you may choose to apply for. This experience can then be used to enhance further applications, such as personal statements and employment applications.

The underpinning of these attributes is the key foundation to have a readiness to take part and contribute and most importantly a drive to take the next steps in your career.



CAREERS LAUNCH



During the Careers Launch you will learn about a range of relevant careers options. This is a great opportunity for you to start considering what you would like to do when you leave Wyke and gain an understanding of the different routes into your chosen career.

Throughout this time, universities and employers will discuss the different opportunities they offer, giving you a greater insight into the career paths relating to your chosen subjects. The launch, which is a two day event, will be delivered through a variety of engaging opportunities, including, market stalls, talks and workshops.

The Careers Launch will be split into 5 different areas, all of which are available to students and these include:

RESEARCH

The research period provides an excellent opportunity for you to explore a wide range of next step options, gaining an understanding of which sector you may want to progress on to and the best route to take. This is a key part of the next steps process as it allows you to gather all of the information you need in order to make an informed choice.

We offer a range of support, this could include:

LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION (LMI)

One of the key ways of gathering information is to find out what is going on in the labour market. This could include looking at reports, studies, statistics and other information about key topics linked to the sector you are interested in. This could include: Sector growth and decline, employment rates, supply and demand of labour, future labour trends and salaries.

At Wyke, you will access labour market information through many forms, from talks from employers about their sector, visits, and accessing the many resources the Careers team and your subject teacher have gathered.

We are linked with a local, well established Enterprise Adviser that has a wealth of knowledge regarding labour market information and they support the College regularly to engage with our students.

Work experience is hugely beneficial, it gives you a clear understanding of what is involved in a potential career path. The main benefit is gaining the key employability skills and identifying if this is the sector you would like to work in.

OUTREACH PROGRAMMES

Outreach Programmes are summer courses which are designed to support students' and their journey to university as well as providing academic skills and insights into university life. After completion of the programme universities may provide a reduced offer. We will support you to access and apply for these.

For some universities and courses, you are required to apply to UCAS early, these include:

PORTFOLIO/AUDITION

Depending on the course you are applying for, you may be asked to supply a portfolio or attend an audition. Here at Wyke, we can support you to prepare for this crucial stage of the application process.

APPLICATION TIME

From September in the 2nd year of your study you will hopefully by now have a clear understanding of the sector you would like to either work or study in.

Now is the time to be preparing to complete an application form, whether this be a UCAS application to university or thinking about a degree apprenticeship. We offer individual advice and guidance on applying and dedicated support in tutorial and in the classroom to all students.

We will work through each stage with you ensuring you have completed the application and had chance to reflect and think about the best answers to suit your application. We encourage you to think about the employability skills you have developed through the enrichment activities you have carried out in your first year. How they are transferable in apply for your next step.

We also support with the next stages of the application, this could include:

- Competing a portfolio
- Interview preparation
- Assessment centre preparation
- Online tests

PRE-DESTINATION SUPPORT

After months of research, finding out about which destination will suits them best, our students should have completed an application and have successfully been accepted onto their chosen next step. There may be some students where their application is not open until a lot later in the academic year,

the Careers Team will support students on an individual basis throughout their study programme so they will still be able to apply and carry out these pre-destination checks.

This part of the Careers programme supports students with a package of information that will enable them to carry out the final preparation for moving on from the college and entering the next stage of their Career.

DESTINATION INFORMATION

At Wyke 6th Form College, on results day, tutors and the Careers Team are around to share and join in the celebration of our students success regarding next steps.

The majority of our students progress onto amazing university and apprenticeship destinations including studying at Oxbridge and many Russell Group universities, prestigious art and dance schools, degree apprenticeships at The Dyson Institute, IBM, EY and PwC. We ensure that our students are ready for their next steps and fully prepared.

However there are a small proportion of students that decide to take a gap year or might not have a clear destination and require additional support after college. The Careers team is on hand to support students – they can book an appointment and pop in for a 1 – 1. They will definitely be around to guide and support. Students can apply for university as a Wyke alumni. The college hold sessions for such students and they come in and we can attach their University application to the college and help with references etc.

We have an excellent alumni group that come back into the college and talk to students about their experiences and their journey. They make a connection with our students who understand that they were once in that position.
