This policy statement sets out the colleges arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the college for the purpose of giving them information about the providers education or training offer. This complies with the college's legal obligations under the section 42B of the Education Act 1997.


### Student entitlement

All students in the college take part in a dedicated careers programme, along with access to a dedicated careers team, who together, with teachers and tutors work closely to ensure that throughout their study programme they develop, grow and are equipped with the right skills and qualities to progress. The programme will enable students to:

- Have personalised guidance and how to access this from the careers team
- Be given personal 1-1 support with applications to HE/apprenticeship/employment applications
- Develop the skills they need to plan and manage their own personal development
- Give feedback on their views on the quality of the careers programme
- Develop an understanding of what key employability skills are
- Gain understanding on the different entry routes into their possible career path
- Be given direct access to employers, training providers and Higher Education institutions
- Experience the world of work through work placements, employer talks and industry events

### Opportunities for access

At Wyke our dedicated careers programme follows a timeline structure incorporating many key occasions for access across the two-year cycle. Several of our events offer providers an opportunity to come into college to speak to students, and at times their parents/carers.
