Previously known as postnatal depression, perinatal anxiety and depression during pregnancy and early parenthood (the perinatal period) affects almost 100,000 Australians each year, equating to 1 in 5 new mums and 1 in 10 new dads. Gidget is the nickname of a vibrant young mother from Sydney who took her own life while suffering from unrecognised postnatal depression. She hid her suffering even from her loving family and friends. They created Gidget Foundation Australia, determined that what happened to Gidget would not happen to others.

Today, Gidget Foundation Australia assists thousands of expectant and new parents and their families each year and provides psychological counselling services to <u>parents in need</u> through its <u>Gidget House</u> face-to-face services (at an expanding number of locations), its <u>Start Talking</u> telehealth program and Emotional Wellbeing antenatal screening programs conducted through participating hospitals. Gidget Foundation Australia is a not-for-profit organisation, supported by the community, the corporate sector, the medical profession, the NSW and Commonwealth Governments, and the media.
