In the twenty years since her first short story collection, The Spectacle of the Body, Noy Holland has become a singular presence in American writing. Her second and third collections, What Begins With Bird and Swim for the Little One First, secured her reputation as a writer who excels and excites, her prose described as unsettling and acutely wrought, rhythmic and lyrically condensed. Following last year's publication of Bird, her first novel, I Was Trying to Describe What It Feels Like is a gathering of 44 stories-14 from her previous collections and 30 never before published in book form. Set on two continents and ranging in length from a single page to a novella, these stories beguile and disrupt; they remind us of the reach of our compassion and of the dazzling possibilities of language.

The collection begins with "Orbit"--a prismatic tale of a brother and sister gone feral in the American south, navigating their mother's slow dying and their father's bewildering absence. Prairie fire and a near-fatal injury find correspondence in "Blood Country"; in "Duende" a mother sets out across a menacing landscape to look for her missing son. Often the drama of Holland's stories is quieter-a stolen kiss, a wandering mendicant, a candy offered to a young boy blinded in the womb. "I Was Trying to Describe What it Feels Like," from which the collection takes its title, is part love song, part fever dream-a voice demanding the eestatic. Holland's stories do not indulge in easy emotions, and they keep to the blessedly blurred frontier between poetry and prose.



In 1940, Edmund Wilson was the undisputed g dog of American letters. Vladimir Nabokov is a near-penniless Russian exile seeking asylum the States. Wilson became a mentor to Nabov, introducing him to every editor of note, asining him book reviews for The New Republic, gineering a Guggenheim Fellowship. Their timate friendship blossomed over a shared terest in all things Russian, ruffled a bit by ilitical disagreements. But then came the worldde best-selling novel Lolita, and the tables were rned. Suddenly Nabokov was the big (and very :h) dog. The feud finally erupted in full when abokov published his hugely footnoted and rtually unreadable literal translation of Pushn's famously untranslatable verse novel, Eugene negin. Wilson attacked his friend's translation th hammer and tongs in The New York Review Books. Nabokov counterattacked. Back and rth the increasingly aggressive letters flew, until e narcissism of small differences reduced their iendship to ashes.

Alex Beam has fashioned this clash of litery titans into a delightful and irresistible book comic contretemps of a very high order and a signant demonstration of the fragility of even e deepest of friendships.





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

In this unique memoir, every recollection of La particular time and place in the author's life includes a novel she is reading, a novel that seems to be moving somewhere in the background. But as her memory grows more vivid, it becomes clear that the novel is in fact shaping her life, illuminating it. Reading Willa Cather's Lucy Gayheart, as a young girl, prepares her for the shocking death of the father of a gifted student in her music class. Later, newly married and living as a teacher in Nigeria, she reads Chinue Achebe's Things Fall Apart with her students and is instructed by them in the deeper meanings of the novel: the rich density of Igbo life that preceded the arrival of the Europeans whose colonial ambitions dismantled its authority. In Nigeria, too, she reads Henry James' The Portrait of a Lady and, turning its pages, ponders her own marriage.

Later on, spending a year in northern France in a landscape deeply pocked by two world wars, she puts Madame Bovary firmly aside to read a lesser known novel, Diary of a Country Priest by Georges Bernanos, a novel set precisely in the scarred countryside where she finds herself. At last she learns to recognize the hidden poor living beside her and, crucially, is made aware of her own desire to distance herself from their suffering.

The memoir closes with a tender account of the author's friendship with the writer Diana Trilling, whose failing sight inspires a plan to read aloud Proust's masterwork, an undertaking that takes six years to complete. What does it mean to live? they ask each other. What does it mean to love? Faced with Diana's approaching death and the mysteries of her own life, the author wonders whether reading may after all be experience at its most ardent, its most transforming. 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
